Bishop Trevor Edwards

Dear sisters and brothers,

The other night in our joint Bible reading and prayer time I was struck by a text from 1 Peter 4:9 which I found personally relevant but also so apt for the current life of this parish that I shared it on Monday night with our Parish Council. The Apostle Peter wrote -Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins.

This must be the chief priority in any family of God. Without it we lose all credibility as followers of Jesus. He is not just encouraging brotherly or sisterly love, but is commanding that we love one another with God's love which is cross-shaped. As Jesus himself said we are to love one another as he has loved us (John 13:34). Peter therefore says *love each other deeply*. He is talking about intense effort because the word was used of a horse at full gallop, stretching every muscle in a sustained way. Loving others in a Christ like way demands our all, because we are not just to love the ones we like, but the unlovely and unlovable. It may mean loving in spite of injury, insult or misunderstanding. It may involve loving when love is not returned or even spurned. Moreover, even members of God's family still bear the disfiguring marks of sin. Some are still pushy and not humble. Some have sharp tongues or quick tempers. Some get in a huff about little things while others harbour long bitter memories. All these situations require a 'stretching' sort of love, but this remains our first priority.

Furthermore, if we are able to reproduce God's love in our midst here, then this church will become much more attractive in this community, because God's love is a forgiving and accepting love which *covers a multitude of sins*. We are called to be peacemakers. Love always finds a way to bring wrongdoers back into fellowship and shield the penitent from condemnation. Remember Jesus loved the woman caught in adultery without condoning her sin. Recall how when dying in excruciating pain he prayed *Father forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing*. We are called to imitate Jesus in loving forgiveness and acceptance of others. It is a bit like a wife asking her husband whether he will still love her when she is old and wrinkled and he answers with a twinkle in his eyes 'I do!"

So it should be in the household of faith. A stretching love should cover or hide a multitude of sins. In a world hungering for authentic relationships such loving in this church will be a most powerful apologetic to a watching world. As someone has rightly said recently: If we love one another deeply then others will be drawn to the people of God and meet the God of the people.
