Update for the Ipswich Branch Members

Inaugural Ride for Awareness of Domestic & Family Violence Sunday 3 May 2015 10 am to 2 pm at Brothers Leagues Club

Well as of tonight's information meeting there are only 2 sleeps until the Event.

It has been another huge month for the DV Ride Committee with two planning meetings held, with one at the end venue, Brothers Leagues Club, Wildey Street, Raceview ("Brothers") last Sunday. We have crossed our T's and dotted our I's as much as we can, but I am sure Murphy's Law will prevail and there will be little things that happen which will be out of our control. Damn it, being the control freak I am, I will have to let things happen, but I know that the Branch will lend a hand to iron out the creases as they occur.

Ipswich Ride lead by Erik Like I said last month, it is really important that as many as possible of our branch members attend the 8:30 am Ipswich ride leaving from McDonalds Yamanto lead by Erik our ride coordinator. Yep, this is the ride the Police Commissioner is attending and the police bikes from the Blue Knights and of course general public and other supporters on their bikes. Just remember to behave yourselves, and Erik....of course there is no pressure on you! Unfortunately I have had to let Ski know that the Police Minister Jo-ann Miller cannot attend our event or ride on the Trike due to the Labour Day March in Bris Vegas, but I have organised for Jennifer Howard MP to take on the ride instead.

Set up /Pull Down Some of us will be setting up the venue from 7 am at "Brothers", you are more than welcome to come along to help with setting up marquees etc — as long as you leave in time to go on the Ipswich ride with Erik. (I know, I know, I have said that already)We will need all hands on deck for the pull down, pack up and clean up at the end of the day and people to help out at the Fairy Floss and Snow Cone machines. It is envisaged that the participants will arrive between 10 am and 10:30 am ish.

Ride / Route leaders will be selling the Arm Bands (which has the raffle ticket # printed on it) at the leave points. \$10 each. The participants will pick up their patch/pin from the Registration Booth on arrival at Brothers.

Parking at Brothers We have been assigned a parking area in the right hand lower parking area of Brothers Car Park and have organised Parking Marshalls for participants on motorbikes/trikes. Unfortunately 'tin top parking' will not be allowed with the motorbikes/trikes as we need to make sure we have sufficient parking for them. Can I ask our members to park tin tops in the carpark off South Station Road (there is an entry gate there for you to come into the grounds). You can pay your rego of \$10 and pick up your pin/patch at either the Rego booth where the bikes are parking or from the Ipswich Ulysses Marquee. I really ask that we respect the request from Brothers to leave the other parking areas for their customers on the day.

Show and Shine: Marshalls will direct participants in the Show n Shine to a parking area inside the fenced area of Brothers. Participants in the Show n Shine can head back to the Registration Booth to pick up their pin or patch or get them from the Ulysses Marquee. *Entry of motorcycles/trikes*

etc to the Show and Shine is via the arm band. The Categories are: Best Jap, Best European, Best American, Best 3 Wheeler & Peoples' Choice. Entries in the show and shine will be given a sticker to be placed on their headlight to identify them. The winners for the categories will be chosen by a representative from Shannons Insurance (Our sponsor), DaZar from our Branch and John from DVAC (Domestic Violence Action Centre) who will be attending the Ipswich ride on his own bike. At the Shannons marquee there will be a Box for the public to place their nominations in for Peoples Choice.

Registration Booth We have the registration booth on entry for participants near the motorbike parking, and will also have **Arm Bands / Pins / Patches for sale at our Ipswich Ulysses Booth.**

Formalities on the day: We will have speeches starting at 11 am ish with a raffle draw, more speeches at around 12 noon ish, re-draw of the uncollected raffle prizes around then; and another redraw of raffle prizes if we need it. Winning numbers will be written on a whiteboard in the undercover area.

Food & Drinks: Brothers Juniors Rugby League are running the canteen, and have a BBQ set up. These are all for sale at the normal canteen prices. There will also be some limited alcohol for sale which needs to be consumed in the assigned area only. We will have signage for this.

Entertainment loads of stalls and information will be available, as well as jumping castle etc and a Bucking Bull for participants who purchase the arm band. The Duo Band "Just the Ticket" will be adding their touch on the day. Just enjoy yourself – that's all we ask.

Tomorrow Night Saturday 2nd May 2015

Its time to get out your Chrissy Lights and Bling up your Ride for the Ipswich Festival Parade, Saturday 2nd May 2015 (yep..... the night before our DV Awareness Ride).

We are Float # 44. Our arrival time is 5:15 pm and we have been asked to arrive at Darling St on the railway side of the road facing Waghorn Street (entry from Ellenborough St into Darling Street). We can meet at Yamanto Macca's to leave at 5:05 pm – to arrive together if you like, or make your own way there – as long as you aren't too early or too late – as I said 5:15 pm is our assigned time.

at \$12.50 being the popular choice. Definitely worth another visit.


After lunch there were some smart people who put on their wet weather. Those of us who didn't have theirs with them were a bit envious as it wasn't long before the heavens opened
