Kind: It is a short week, Kindergarten! This week we will focus on bats. Our vocabulary words are swoop, clutch, escape, clamber, and curious. We will continue to work on /g/ and /o/ sounds. We will not be adding new sight words this week, but please continue to work hard on the ones we already have. Thank you! **- Mrs. Stewart**

1st/2nd: As we start second quarter, please remind your child that they will have 5 AR tests again this quarter and the books need to be in their reading level. Please don't wait until the end of the quarter to start when you can begin working on them now. **First and second grade will have a spelling test this week on Thursday. First grade will also have a math test on Thursday. Second grade will have a math test on Tuesday.** Also, please be sure to practice math facts with your child each night. Flash cards have been sent home, but if they are "lost" let me know and we can get more. It shows in their daily work, if they are practicing.

3rd/4th: First quarter has come and gone. Now that we are in the second quarter, our AR goals start over. I have decided to change up a few things with our AR. Students will still have a number of book requirements, as well as fiction and nonfiction. Books still have to be in each individual's reading level, but I am not going to require a page minimum. All books will need to be approved by myself before they can count towards their AR goals. AR tests will still need to be passed by an 80% or higher to count towards their goals as well. If you have questions about AR, please let me know. **Our spelling test will be on Thursday instead of Friday.** I have no other tests planned for this week. I look forward to seeing you all Thursday at Parent Teacher Conferences. **Mrs. Cooper**

5th/6th: In Writing, 6th graders will continue working on Patriot's Pen essays. **In Science, 5th graders will test over Ch. 2 on Tuesday** and 6th grade will be finishing Ch. 1 over "Matter". In Reading, both grades will read Ch. 3 & 4 of our Lit. Circle book "The Egypt Game" and will present roles on Wed. **In Social Studies, 5th grade will test over Ch. 1 L. 1 & 2 on Thursday** and 6th grade will be reading about the Mayan and Aztec civilizations. **7/8 Comm. Arts:** Students will be reading Ch. 5 & 6 of our Lit. Circle book. The poster project over "The Witch of Blackbird Pond" is due on Thursday. Have a great week and I look forward to seeing parents at conferences on Thursday! **-Mrs. Foster**

5/6 Math: In fifth grade, students are looking at early geometry concepts and practicing the division algorithm on bigger dividends. In sixth grade, students are continuing to learn strategies for fraction/decimal/percent equivalents and recalling the steps of operations with both fractions and decimals.

7/8: In social studies, seventh grade has been doing a lot with using text features such as maps and various types of timelines. Eighth grade will be moving toward the early efforts at expanding beyond the original 13 colonies. In math, seventh grade is working on solving harder proportions and concepts related to triangles. In pre-algebra, students are working on harder problems involving order of operations and learning about volume of complex 3-D shapes. In algebra, students are learning about algebraic phrases which translate into expressions and equations and the factoring of algebraic expressions. I'm looking forward to seeing all of the parents on Thursday. **Tests this Week: 7/8 Social Studies: Thursday -Mr. Ewing**
