The tradition began more than half a century ago and now includes 800,000 lights over 10 acres of land and attracts thousands of visitors annually, without an admission charge. There are indoor and outdoor chapels, displays of Nativity scenes from around the world and places for contemplation and reflection.

We will meet at the Senior Center for a 3pm departure and will return at 9pm. The cost is \$20 per person which includes the drivers tip. You need to be signed up and paid by November  $22^{nd}$  as the bus only holds 47 passengers.

The shrine will offer hot beverages for sale and other refreshments, and the gift shop will be open.



### Veteran's Day Breakfast


Veterans, active military, and their families are invited to a free breakfast at the Federated Community Church on November 11, 2015. The breakfast will


