Preschool: I hope you all enjoyed your three-day weekend! It was nice to have an extra day! This week we will talk about apples. We will learn how to pick them, what colors they can be and which ones are our favorites! We will learn a song about apples too! Our book focus this week will be "Ten Apples Up on Top". We will do activities that go along with this book. We are adjusting nicely to our routine! I hope you have a great, short week! - Miss Stacie

Kind: I hope everyone had a great three-day weekend! This week we are going to review the letter sound /s/ and both /a/ sounds. We will also introduce the letter sound /t/. In Math, we will continue learning about our manipulatives and working on how to write numbers 1-10. In writing, we have been practicing vertical and horizontal lines. This week we will introduce backward circle lines and forward circle lines. Our focus during reading this week will be friends, using the books Huggapotomus and The Crayon Box That Talked. As a reminder, work goes home on Mondays (Tuesday this week) with a slip to sign, stating that you saw it. Please remember to read for 10 minutes each night, sign the reading calendar and check your child's folder for homework Monday through Thursday. - Mrs. Stewart

1st/2nd: This week in first grade we will be reading Fire Trucks by Judith Jango-Cohen. This is a nonfiction book so we will talk a lot about nonfiction vs fiction. We will also go over main idea and details to support the main idea. In math we are working on reading/writing/drawing squares and circles, writing numbers 0, 6, 8, 9, and understanding the meaning of right/left and fewer (less than)/more (greater than). This week in second grade we will read the story

A Bad Case of Stripes by David Shannon. We will talk about germs and how to stay healthy. We will also work on main character, summarizing a story, and alphabetizing. In math we will be discussing position words (left/right), filling in missing numbers on a hundreds chart, counting by 10s and 5s, and adding double digits. The spelling test is Thursday this week because of no school on Monday. If students miss one or less, they don't have to retake the test on Friday! First and second grade will have a math test on Friday, as well as a reading test. The reading test will be every Friday and it covers comprehension questions and vocabulary words we have focused on all week. - Mrs. Thomas

3rd/4th: Welcome back! I hope everyone was able to enjoy the long week. We now have our first full week down in the books. With this week being a short week, things might look a little different in our weekly routine. We will still have a spelling test this week. Students received their lists today and will have the test on Friday. There will not be any ABC order this week. Also, we will be finishing chapter 1 in Science. Be on the lookout for study guides to go home tomorrow with students. The plan is to review in class on Thursday and test on Friday. Please let me know, if you have any questions. - Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: I hope everyone enjoyed the long weekend! Students will have their Spelling test on Friday since it's a short week. In Science, both grades will be making cell models on Friday. I will be asking each student to bring in one food item to help with this project. In English, 5th and 6th graders will be looking at simple subjects and predicates. In Reading, students will practice finding cause and effect. In Social Studies, 5th graders are reading about early explorers to the Americas and 6th grade will look at early Native American civilizations. **7th /8th Grade Comm. Arts:** I'm really happy to see students already passing AR tests! Keep up the great work. This week students will be looking at types of conflict in a story and next week, we will start on Patriot's Pen essays. - Mrs. Foster

5/6 Math: In fifth grade, students continue practicing their number operations and looking at the relationships between those operations and working on strategies related to story problems. In sixth grade, students are working on part/whole relationships, geometry vocabulary involving lines, measurements, and perimeter, and types of scales. **Tests This Week:** 5th Math: Wednesday **7/8:** In grammar, both seventh and eighth are working on identifying sentences and sentence parts. In math, seventh grade students are working on the nature of fractions and looking at patterns in story problems. Pre-algebra students are working on operations involving decimals, perimeter of complex shapes, and prime factorization. In algebra, we are working on the relationship between zero and division, more complex order of operations, and evaluation of algebraic expressions. **Tests This Week:** 7th/8th Social Studies: Wednesday, 8th Science: Thursday, 7th Math: Thursday, Pre-Algebra: Thursday - Mr. Ewing
