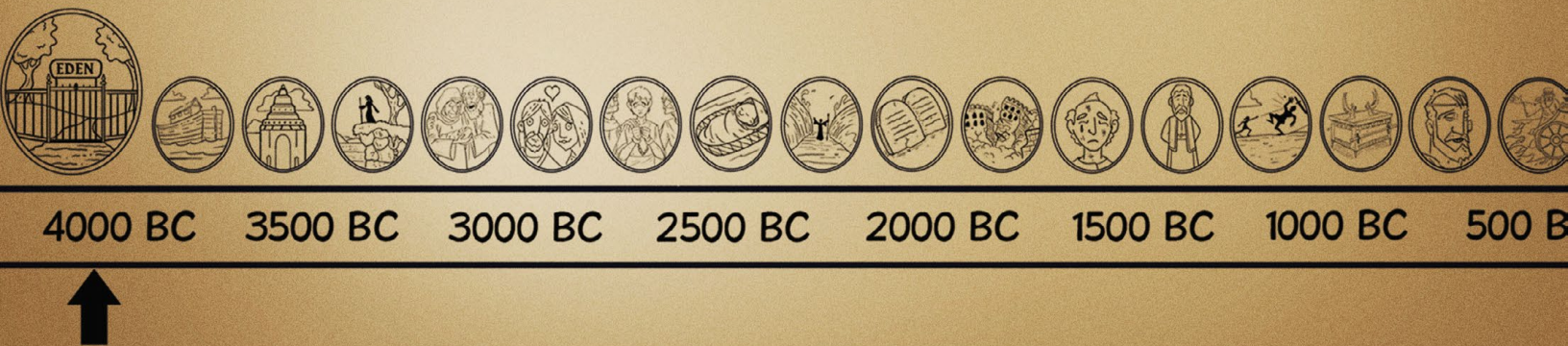

# INTRODUCTION

## BIBLE STORY FACT FILES

Welcome to Bible Story Fact Files, a way to learn all the fun detail God offered us in his Word! Students can play a table game, have a relay, or simply take turns telling Bible stories in their own words. It's all part of this series, which teaches Bible stories—helping students learn both the details and the overview!

Your students will have the scoop on 25 Old and New Testament stories after filling out the pages. They will know the who-what-when-where-why of each and will know where to find it via all the Bible lookups.

Let's look at the package and all the ways to use it.

### What's Inside

There are Bible Story Fact Files sheets for 25 Bible classics. You'll find them all listed in the What's Inside Section preceding this intro. Each story contain herein comes with the following:

**7-9 Bible Lookup Questions** are on each sheet, which will provide your students with the great details about the stories. Were Noah and his family on the Ark for 40 days and nights? Did the Ark land in a mud puddle down in Egypt?? No on both counts! The Flood waters took 150 days to recede, and Noah's family was on the Ark for months! It landed in the mountains of Ararat, which are still being surveyed for sightings by today's believers! . We provide some fun ways to engage students in these lookups—including our two games: ***Tell that Bible Story and Bible Hands Down.***

**A UNSCRAMBLE Puzzle** is included on each page that may or may not require a Bible lookup. Because kids love puzzles, this will be sure to intrigue while teaching them a famous Bible saying by or about that hero.

**A BOXED ACTIVITY** provides a variety of exercises in thinking, remembering, or illustrating—while stretching imaginations and having fun!

**Teacher's ANSWER SHEETS** are provided for all 25 stories. They cover not only answers to the Bible lookup questions, but also to the descrambled phrases.

### How to Use the *Bible Story Fact Files*

These sheets are designed to help children remember 25 of the most classic Bible stories, but there are other perks as well. One is to get children accustomed to doing Bible Lookups. We've divided lookups into two parts, which you can help them with:

**Bible Book & Chapter Lookups:** These major lookups are at the top of each worksheet page, above the title of the story. They will bring children to the starting chapter of the story. Many stories are simply one chapter.

Some stories, especially those in Genesis, are spread out over several chapters. In that case, only the first chapter is mentioned in the Lookup to get kids where they need to begin.

Concerning Jesus' death and resurrection, it is important to see varying details from more than one Gospel. In those cases, both books and chapters are included at the top of each page.

**Bible Verse Lookups:** These are the little numbers before each verse in the Bible. They can be more challenging for new students, so we've separated them out to work with separately, after the Book & Chapter has been found. The 7-9 questions about each story can be answered when they look up the Bible verse.

**For optimal learning:** We suggest printing out a few copies of the Chapters of the Bible page to place on the learning table (follows this section). It will help your students navigate and learn the order of Bible Books. If a story is in more than one Bible book, such as the end of Jesus' life, we suggest they find both books before starting, marking the 2nd one with a slip of paper or bookmark.

Have students read the entire story before beginning to answer the questions on the sheet. Several stories are too long for this, and in that case, just have students read as much as they can without being distracted. You know your own class and can make that determination based on your individual students.

Keeping the Bible open to the Bible Book and Chapter Lookup, they can begin doing the Bible Verse Lookups and filling in the answers.

**Two Reinforcement Games are Included:** We're suggesting two games your students can play with the sheets, though the sheets can also be used as a straight learning tool. The games just add fun and intrigue.

### **Use the New International Version of the Bible**

Whether playing games or just using the sheets for learning, it is important to use the New International Version (NIV) of the Bible with the sheets. Some of the answers are exacting, and another version might confuse players.

### **How This Series Will Make a Difference**

Our world is teeming with life, all of which points to the glory of God. Similarly, our Bible is teeming with detail, all of which tells us something about God. His nature, his desires for us, and his unfolding plan are all seen through the details he provides us in his word. After using this material, your students will have discovered not only favorite stories, but favorite details that will live on in their hearts into adulthood!

Do children understand that God's love is deep enough to invite thieves and liars into heaven? The words of the thief beside Jesus on the Cross tell us that anyone sorry is invited! Will kids simply adapt to government-school ideas, such as there have never been miracles, and the world has been



chronically the same for billions of years? Let them read Goliath's height. Let them see how long the Flood waters kept Noah's family on the ark. Let the Holy Spirit feed souls with details that will grow into a grand overview of life with God and Jesus over time.

## **GAME #1: TELL THAT BIBLE STORY!**

Use this game with any Bible story included in the Bible Story Fact File series that takes place all in one chapter. Fifteen of our stories qualify! Just glance down the worksheet and be sure that all questions come from the same chapter, and then use this game to reinforce the overview and details presented.

The game involves not only learning the fine details of classic Bible stories but the art of storytelling itself! As all kids love to tell stories, this game will be engaging and fun for all.

### **Materials Needed**

- *Bible Story Fact File Sheets* (included)
- Copies of the Bible in NIV, one copy for each pair of students
- Pencils
- Timer, such as the one on a smartphone
- Basket or container, such as a collection basket

### **Preparation**

1. Print 1 copy of the same Bible Story Fact File sheet for each pair.
2. Establish the pairs of students. (Establish fair pairs. Two eleven-year-olds against two seven-year-olds is not exactly fair!)
3. Give each pair 1 Bible Story Fact File Sheet, pencils and a Bible.

### **Rules**

1. Have everyone find the Bible Book & Chapter Lookup together in the Bibles.
2. Have students take turns reading the chapter or passage of the chapter where the story takes place.
3. When you say, "GO," pairs have five minutes to do all eight lookups. They can have one teammate doing the writing and the other teammate doing the Bible Verse Lookups and pointing to the correct answer.
4. At the end of five minutes, say, "STOP."
5. Use the Teacher's Answer sheet to determine which pairs got all the answers correct. Those pairs qualify to enter the storytelling round.



## **Story-Telling Round**

6. Pairs who qualify for the story-telling round must retell the Bible story in their own words. Pairs can decide between themselves who will tell the story best—with both accuracy and enthusiasm.
7. While they can leave out some or even all details on the worksheet, pairs should be remembering back to the reading before the details and tell the Bible story in their own words.
8. Everyone should watch the sheets to make sure no wrong information is given. If a reciter recites two facts that are wrong, he is disqualified. However, reciters should be told that this phase is not about the details. It is about letting a great story roll through their imaginations and out their mouths.
9. The class votes on who told the most animated, smooth and captivating account. Again, they are not voting on the most correct details presented. They are voting on the telling that was most interesting while being most accurate.
10. The person who wins this round wins the game along with his teammate.

## **GAME #2: BIBLE STORY HANDS DOWN**

### **(RELAY GAME)**

#### **Materials**

- How Well Do You Know Sheet, 1 copy for each student
- Bibles in NIV Translation
- Pencils
- Index cards

#### **Preparation**

If some of your students are younger than seven, pair them with an older student who is a good reader. They can do the pencil work and circling while the older student does the reading and Bible Verse Lookups. Other students may work alone or in pairs depending on the number of students you have and variety in your group.

Using the Teacher's Answer Sheet, write the correct answers on different index cards. Keep them in a stack on the table.

#### **Rules & Instructions**

##### *Round 1 (Lookups)*

1. Have all students do the Bible Book & Chapter Lookup Together. Once all have found it, say "Go!"
2. Give students five minutes to complete all eight Bible Verse Lookups and fill out the sheets.
3. Go over the answers together. Any student or pair who gets all answers correct should be applauded.

##### *Round 2 (Relay)*

4. Have students turn their papers over so they can no longer see the questions or answers.
5. Lay out the index cards with the answers written on them on the table.
6. Have students stand up so they can reach any of the cards as easily as anyone else.
7. Read a question. Do not read them in order.
8. The student who first slaps card containing the answer wins. (You will be able to tell who slapped the answer first, because his hand will be on the bottom if there are lots of students.)
9. That student may take the card into his possession.

10. Repeat until all the questions have been read.
11. The student with the most cards at the rounds end wins the round.
12. Lay out all the answers again and play again to further reinforce these details.
13. Go over the answers together. Any student or pair who gets all answers correct should be applauded.

**Suggestions:**

1. If students can't resist the urge to guess and do extremely poorly, have them complete the same Fact File sheet again--after hearing the answers from the Teachers' Answer Sheet. If some team members remember the answers once this repeat round begins, they have the option to shout to their teammate whose turn it is. However, the other team will likely hear. (Pig Latin has been a workable solution for some).
2. While scoring the first round, announce to students that they will be completing the same sheet in the next round so to listen carefully to answers.

The game ends when the teams have completed as many Fact File sheets as you wish, and the team with the most points wins.
