Dear Parishioners helping to spread the Gospel.

As I write we have celebrated the Ascension and Pentecost. Pentecost was a Jewish festival occurring fifty days after the first day of Passover: as Jews had gathered for this festival, the Holy Spirit descended dramatically with symbolic fire and wind. Two thousand years later, Christians celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Central to our belief is the triune God , that is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. While the Trinity is beyond verbal explanation, understanding of the triune nature of God is embedded in our worship, especially our prayers: we address our prayers to 'our heavenly Father' or to 'Lord Jesus Christ' and we make those prayers with the guidance of and 'in the power of the Holy Spirit'.

In St John 15:26, we read what Jesus said to the eleven apostles: 'When the advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, He will testify on my behalf. You are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning.' The disciples were given the task of testifying: we are the present-day disciples who are charged with testifying about Jesus. Some testify by preaching but all of us testify by the way we live. It is a challenge we hope we can rise to.

We give thanks that we are able to meet again in church and we look forward to having the choir back in St Nicholas' and congregational singing in all our churches. It is understandable that some are not ready to leave the comfort of home and face possible danger by going out. I was nervous when I started driving again for the first few journeys but thankfully my confidence returned. It will be the same for those who are nervous about meeting people again. A man behind the counter in our local paper shop said last week people have forgotten how to talk to each other.

I am glad to know that many of the people we know have been vaccinated; I regret that a few are reluctant to get it. Having been vaccinated the advice I got was that I didn't need to worry about passing on the virus to others but to continue social-distancing and wearing mask where people are together, both as an example to others and to help reduce the spread of other infections.

There will be no further update about the sale of the rectory until after the June Diocesan council meeting. In the meantime we are asking if you know of any suitable house coming on the market for sale or rent: we would like to hear about it.

Faithful God, who fulfilled the promises of Easter by sending us your Holy Spirit and opening to every race and nation the way of life eternal: Open our lips by your Spirit that every tongue may tell of your glory. We pray in the name of Christ our Redeemer. Amen.
