Membership is open to all who are interested in the goals and purposes of the Friendship Force program.



As pandemic conditions improve in the Grand Valley, I am hopeful that there will be occasions for us to get together in person and meet to share some experiences locally. Stay safe.




Hiking in the Monument with our border collie mix restores my soul and makes me grateful for all that I have. I am reminded that many are not so fortunate.

And know there will be a time to travel.



Is it any surprise that the town of Valentines is located in a state with the slogan "Virginia is for lovers?" This small hamlet is more community than town, located within Brunswick County about 100 miles southwest of Norfolk.

Named for the founder and first postmaster, William H. Valentine, the town continues the tradition of stamping mail around February with special Valentine's emblem.




