From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

It has been a while since I write my reflection for you in the bulletin. God granted me to have a few days of vacation and then to be in a Youth Pilgrimage with 250 youth from our parish and surrounding parishes. Listening to the first reading of this Sunday, something caught my eye about grumbling. Let me be more specific – when the organizers of this pilgrimage sat down to prepare it, they tried to consider so many eventualities and things that could happen. It was a very well thought and prepared pilgrimage. We departed and then comes reality. Many of the things that we had planned did not occur as planned. We arrive to the Shrine of the North American Martyrs in Auriesville, NY and to our surprise a group from Arizona approached us if they could celebrate Mass with us and we said yes. Then, we start travelling south to Pennsylvania and every stop that we had scheduled took longer than anticipated (and we had anticipated that it will take long), then there was a traffic accident that put us back 45 minutes. So, we arrived at our camp almost 3 hours late, hungry, and tired. Distributed rooms and went to be grumbling; in a sense like the people of Israel, why did you take us out to bring us into this mess! In the morning, to our surprise, the camp was beautiful and amazing. Many times, we think that what God gives us is bad or wrong or not fair, and we do not want to eat the “manna” that God gives us. In Hebrew “manna” means “what is that?”. What is this bread that God wants to give us? This is the daily bread that God invites us to eat so that we can obtain Eternal Life. God is inviting us to eat this “manna” so that we can experience His wonderful plan. I want to thank you for your generosity with the Missionary Appeal and Cross Catholic. We are planning next Saturday August 7 to have a family hike in Bear Mountain. We invite you to be there at 11:30 AM and then Fr. Preston will guide you through the beautiful scenery so that we can admire the beauty of God's creation. We will finish with a BBQ there. We ask that you register either online or by phone. We ask a contribution of \$10 per family (no matter how many in the family). See you then my dear brothers and sisters!
