ARE THERE NO OUTSIDERS? DOES EVERYBODY BELONG TO JESUS?

In today's Gospel one phrase is repeated twice: "not one of us". The apostle John is indignant that a man outside of their circle is casting out devils. "Because he is not one of us we tried to stop him," John tells Jesus. But Jesus stuns the disciples by telling them that they have no monopoly on the healing power of Jesus. "Anyone who is not against us is for us," he says. The mission of healing and saving humanity and the world is not the sole responsibility of the disciple, or, in today's world, of clergy, or of Catholics. It is a mission that is entrusted to everyone. Jesus does not want to close the circle around him. As long as healing and reconciliation are taking place, Jesus does not draw boundaries. His followers are called to cooperate with all those in the world who are promoting human dignity, assisting those who are vulnerable and taking responsibility for building a more just world. God's spirit is within our family and neighours, and perhaps we can learn to recognise the prophets among us and listen to them.

Perhaps we can even begin to recognise the prophet deep inside or own selves?

WE SHALL CONTINUE TO REQUIRE PEOPLE TO WEAR MASKS UNLESS MEDICALLY EXEMPT

- 1. **Opening of Churches** Church Buildings can be left open unsupervised for individual prayer at times when there are no public acts of worship. OLOL church will be sanitized when it is locked each day.
- 2. <u>Freeing the Benches</u> Ribbons have been taken off the <u>left hand</u> side of the church as this is the side where we do not have to socially distance, <u>but kneelers are NOT to be used</u>. The <u>right hand</u> side of the church will remain socially distanced and taped off, for those who feel the need to shield a bit more.
- 3. 'Leave a Space Cards' are available to pick up from the porch table and at the back of the church so that people who wish to maintain a space between themselves and the next person can put a card beside them on the bench.
- 4. <u>Track and Trace</u> We shall follow our track and trace routines for as long as the NHS system is in operation. We shall keep the track and trace mass sheets, as well as the QR system. **This is mandatory**.
- 5. <u>One Way Systems</u> One way systems are no longer mandatory, but we will continue opening the old main entrance back door, so that people may be allowed to choose by which route they wish to exit from the church.
- 6. <u>Stewards</u> will sanitise the church at the end of mass. We shall therefore continue with two stewards.
- 7. Holy Communion No change please wait for the steward to guide you.
- 8. Congregational singing inside to be reviewed.
- 9. <u>The Offertory Collection</u> For the time being we will continue to ask the congregation to continue to use the baskets (and Dona Contactless facility at OLOL) at the entrance and exits from the churches.
