

Ponderings From The Pastor

INVESTING IN GOD'S FUTURE: LISTENING

HAVE YOU EVER tried to carry a tub of water, or some other liquid? Some of whatever is in that tub *always* sloshes out on your pants and your shoes! No matter how carefully you try to be, no matter how steady and slowly you try to walk, or how level and even you try to keep that tub...SLOSH!

That's because liquid so easily transfers energy. Notice how even the slightest little breeze will ripple a puddle or a pond. By yourself, it seems virtually impossible to carry that tub without spilling some of it. You just can't walk slow enough, or slow down slowly enough, without some of the inertia of your movement being transferred into that tub and



pushing the liquid inside over the edge, even if just a little! But add another person, and try it. You still have to be careful and at least a little coordinated ...but *together*, the two of you have a much better chance of getting the tub from point A to point B without spilling it, or at least without spilling as much as

you would have on your own! Sure, it's a silly little example—but it seems we're made to *need* each other. This is nowhere more true than in the Church today...and in *our* church.

This month—on September 13 to be exact—St. Paul UCC will launch *New Beginnings*. And I will tell you right now that it will be a *total flop* if we decide we don't need each other! Should any one of us choose not to need the rest of us, that person will single-handedly diminish the overall chance for a positive and successful outcome. And should two or more band together and decide in a little group not to need any other group, or the larger group...well, we will to that further extent be wasting our precious time and money. We need each other. We need each other's stories, experiences, and weird personalities! We need each other's successes and failures, foibles and fascinations.

And above all else we need to LISTEN TO EACH OTHER. Your story and my

story may be vastly different—but they are also much more the *same—more than we ever truly realize*.

In <u>Listening To Your Life</u>, the great Frederick Buechner writes about why this is so...

Frederick Buechner

"LIFE BATTERS AND shapes us in all sorts of ways before it's done, but those original selves which we were born with and which I believe we continue in some measure to be no matter what are selves which still echo with the holiness of their origin. I believe that what Genesis suggests is that this original self, with the print of God's thumb still upon it, is the most essential part of who we are and is buried deep in all of us as a source of wisdom and strength

and healing which we can draw upon or, with our terrible freedom, not draw upon as we choose. I think that among other things all real art comes from that deepest self—painting, writing music, dance, all of it that in some way nourishes the spirit and enriches the understanding. I think that our truest prayers come from there too, the often unspoken, unbidden prayers that can rise out of the lives of unbelievers as well as believers whether they recognize them as prayers or not. And I think that from there also come our best dreams and our times of gladdest playing and taking it easy and all those moments when we find ourselves being better or stronger or braver or wiser than we are."

This is *not* to say of course that we should never speak up or hold our tongue when we have something to offer—especially something pertinent or relevant. Not at all—there can be no listening without some speaking! But listening must be *afforded at least equal time* on my part and yours as speaking. We need to really hear and experience each other's' "original selves," to hear each other's truest prayers—especially those unspoken and unbidden ones—and really try to experience one another's hidden art and wisdom and strength...so that all this can maybe refine and maybe even reshape our own selves and our group self, our church.

I'll be praying for this—that we will deeply appreciate more and more how we need each other and need to listen with respect, dignity and care to one another, throughout the New Beginnings process. I ask you to join me in this prayer, and to ask God to help *you* yourself be a good listener, to give you self-insight and growing self-awareness....and for God to help us all to "*find ourselves being better or stronger or braver or wiser than we are.*"




