Getting Started

Have you been looking for a way to impact the culture in America for Christ? Consider becoming the affiliate leader of a FACE Principled Studies Group.

One of the first steps is to articulate why such a study group is necessary. A Principled Studies Group ministry makes it easy to:

- 1. Educate and equip your community or church congregation to apply a Biblical worldview to every area of life, especially to those issues undermining our Judeo-Christian culture.
- 2. Empower others to make a meaningful difference in our society by standing up for Biblical values in the public square.
- 3. Keep you informed about current events relating to life, marriage, education, the family, religious liberty, business and more.
- 4. Restore the Bible's relevance in the critical areas of government, education, media, and business/economics.
- 5. Multiply the impact and influence of Study Group members.
- 6. Live out the Great Commission in self and civil government that leads to the restoration of our Christian Constitutional Republic.
- 7. Use social media to reach others with the truth that you are learning and, therefore, to maximize your efforts.
- 8. Engage and activate the next generation as you teach truth to those in your sphere of influence.

Finding A Venue

After deciding to lead a Principled Studies Group, the first step is to find a venue for your group meeting. You might explore establishing a study in your church, as this is where believers meet weekly already. It provides the facility needed, and it provides the opportunity to give members of your congregation access to this critical information.

Others will decide to have the study in their home or in another community setting. Doing so enables you to reach out to all of the churches in your area for potential study group members.

How often should you meet? Answers may vary on this question as individual situations differ. However, the ideal is weekly. Meeting once per week for an hour yields about 50 hours of meeting time per year. **Twice per month should be considered a minimum.** Your goal also should be to have a yearround group. The course is scalable and can be tailored to your individual group. We all need time to be equipped in these valuable truths and to take action.

Approval from your church leadership: Every church has an adult education program. This is the place to start with gaining approval to have a Principled Studies Group in your church. Some churches have adult education on Sundays while others have small groups that meet during the week. Some churches have both. Either one will work for your study group. Begin by approaching the person in your church responsible for adult education. You can present the letter on page 14 to them and talk through the details while answering their questions. Feel free to customize the letter as appropriate.

Teacher or Facilitator?

You have a place to meet, a time, a targeted group and are almost ready to announce your first class. Now you must ensure the best curriculum and instruction. If you are already a seasoned teacher, you are confident that you can choose one of FACE's books or curricula and get started. As you are probably aware, FACE has many excellent print-only curricular items for you to use.

If you are not an experienced teacher, the prospect of presenting material may be daunting. For you, there are programs, pre-recorded, with Power Point slides, and printed materials for the Principled Studies Group meetings. With these programs you will need to do only minimal preparation. You will be the class facilitator, learning together with your friends. In this role you will guide all of the components of the class: announcements, prayer, presentation of recorded materials, discussion, application and action. Our library of over seventy reasonably-priced courses, workshops, lectures, and training videos are available in the FACE bookstore at FACE.net under the "SHOP" tab then go to *Training Courses*. Gathering a Group

You have a place to meet, have chosen a course to teach and are ready to go! The only thing left to obtain is...some eager students! If you are in a church, marketing of your class should be fairly easy. You will contact church leadership and ask to have access to all of the marketing venues of the church: church bulletin, live or video announcements, church website, bulletin boards, etc.

If your meeting is not in your church, you have to find other ways to market. Here is a sample marketing piece:

Come and join a new Principled Studies Group designed to equip members to learn every subject from the Biblical perspective. Members learn to apply what they have learned to their own lives, their family, the church, business and the marketplace, and to civil governments. We have what some consider a lofty vision, but we know that this is God's vision for His people.

We envision the United States restored as a culture based on Biblical principles of personal responsibility, individual self-government, maximized individual liberty, limited civil government, federalism, rule of law, moral, free-market capitalism, "with malice toward none and charity for all." God is not a respecter of persons, so we also have this same vision for all 196 nations of the world!

To realize our vision, we will educate ourselves on the Biblical principles of government, economics, family, business, health, religion, education and media. We will advocate for principled political action. We will actively promote Biblical solutions.

As we "take every thought captive for Christ" we will educate members of our community on the Biblical worldview, to include the practical application of Biblical liberty and individual responsibility to all areas of our lives. We will endeavor to give our members practical opportunities to be salt and light in our community, our Commonwealth, and our nation by expressly advocating for Biblical positions on the many issues that confront us in our world today. We want to influence public policy for the sake of the Kingdom. We want to advocate for Biblical standards of holiness, righteousness and justice at all levels of our national life.

Most of all, and supremely, we want to have the knowledge to pass on to the children of this generation to ensure the liberty that is their birthright and our responsibility to pass on.

Conducting a Class

Class formats will vary as individual leaders will structure their studies differently. A typical study will include these elements:

• Introduction and announcements:

The leader/facilitator will give instructions and make announcements concerning actions that members of the class should take. Included are discussions of upcoming events or activities that might interest class members.

• Prayer:

Principled Studies Group prayer typically focuses on the needs of the corporate community, whether they are local, state or federal. Pray for all public servants, "First of all, then, I urge that entreaties and prayers petitions and thanksgivings, be made on behalf of all men, for kings and all who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. This is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior..." (I Timothy 2:1-4).

• Lesson:

The lesson presentation, by video or by leader, should be participatory, including group member questions and comments, and recording key points.

• Discussion of the lesson:

Discuss the application of the timeless truths presented from God's Word and how these truths relate to the individual, family, church, voluntary associations and civil governments.

• Call to action:

Every lesson will end with a call to action, such as a specific item or items that class members can implement.

The Seven Principles of Liberty

What are the Seven Principles of Liberty? These basic, Biblical principles are the pathway to restore and maintain true liberty in our nation.

Today, if we would preserve both liberty of conscience and civil liberty for every individual in America, we must base our convictions in every issue on these principles that built our American Christian Constitutional Republic.

Liberal pundits most often sway public opinion by debating issues. However, Christians can once again win the day by learning to present the principles of liberty, because principles always trump issues. This is the pathway forward to restore our nation to truth and life.

Courses for Principled Studies Groups

The Principled Studies Group will be building a "community of thought" as the five courses are followed. It isn't necessary for the leader to be the teacher. It is most important that the participants commit to learn together, attend the agreed upon calendar of meetings, discuss ideas gleaned from the study freely and respectfully, and prepare to share the understanding of Christian history and Principles of Liberty with others.

There are many resources available to the leader that can be downloaded at FACE/PAstudies.net. (See page 26 for ordering information on resources specific to these courses.) We recommend keeping the study simple, accessible and lively. The FACE mentor is available to coach the leader and answer questions as they arise. The following courses progress from introductory level to a more advanced level.

INTRODUCTORY SESSION

Why Learning Principles is Essential. To set in place a strong purpose for your Principled Studies Group, an introductory session is suggested to present the case for why

Christians must gain a Biblical worldview that they can teach their children and grandchildren. A one-hour video, *Principle Approach vs Common Core*, * explains the role of education in forming a philosophy of government resulting in liberty or bondage.



The Bible and the Constitution of the United States of America: A Primer Of American Liberty. Why are Americans so willing to relinquish the ideal of self-

government to an enlarging and ever-encroaching federal government? Why are we relinquishing our property rights? How can we accept as inevitable the imposed limits to our religious freedom? After witnessing the holocausts spawned by socialism and communism in recent history, why are Americans in denial of its sinister strings threatening our lives and our children's future? Why are most American Christians passive about government while often animated about politics? Each participant uses the published book, *The Bible and the Constitution*, * for this course.

COURSE THREE

Renewing the Mind for Teaching and Learning. The third course in the Principled Studies Group series demonstrates authentic Christian education practiced as the Principle

Approach. The study relies on the book, *Renewing the Mind for Teaching and Learning** that guides the group through the philosophy, methods, and curriculum that form a Biblical worldview, Christian character, and leadership skills as taught before the devolution into progressive education. Video lectures* are available to augment the study as needed.

Each group member will use the book *Renewing the Mind for Teaching and Learning*. The group leader should also have a copy of *The Christian History of the Constitution of the United States of America: Christian Self-Government Vol I* (CHOC I), *Teaching and Learning America's Christian History: The Principle Approach* (T&L), *American Dictionary of the English Language*, Noah Webster 1828 and The Christian History of the American Revolution: Consider and Ponder.*

COURSE FIVE

Learning to Reason with the Biblical Principles of Government. Seven Biblical principles identify the foundation of our American Christian Constitutional Republic. They are also the Biblical principles by which God governs the individual

to produce the Christian character which will support a Republic. These principles can be taught to the youngest child. Defined Biblically and historically in *Teaching and Learning America's Christian History: The Principle Approach* (T&L), the study references their documentation in *The Christian History of the Constitution of the United States: Christian Self-Government* (CHOC I). The seven principles are presented in T&L using its "Key to the Principles" and the readings by page number below.*



1. God's Principle of Individuality

T&L pp. 65-68, 113-117; KEY: pp. 141-183

We state this principle Biblically and then follow it historically. On page 154 of the KEY, we learn how this principle is illustrated in God's Word and the

individuality of the writers He chose to bring His message to mankind. On page 155, we teach each individual the verse:

Starting With Me: God made me special—Like no one else you see God made me a witness—To His diversity.

What follows are points which illustrate the distinctions which God gives each individual He creates. T&L, pages 156-183 provide an overview of the historical appearing of God's Principle of Individuality. It begins with the remarkable work of Arnold Guyot, Christian geographer, who identified the Continents which God created His Story to be Geographic Individuals. What a wonderful way to glorify our Creator as we teach geography from His Story of men and nations!

2. The Christian Principle of Self-Government T&L pp. 69-72; pp. 119-121; KEY pp.184-209

Here you will find teaching information as this principle appears in America's Christian history. On page 188 of T&L are two charts which begin to describe

the actions of a self-governing student at home or in school. On page 189 we find those Pilgrim qualities of self-government which became so important to our nation:

Thrift and Economy Industry and Initiative Self-Reliance and Confidence

As we survey our Colonial history, we can see how important Christian self-government became as God gave us 150 years of preparation throughout all the Colonies to become "one nation under God", able to be self-governing.



3. America's Heritage of Christian Character

T&L pp. 73-75; 123-124; KEY pp. 210-224 The Pilgrims of England who came to America, looked to the first century Christians for their model of character. From these early Christians they learned to

practice the following qualities:

Faith and Steadfastness Brotherly Love and Christian Care Diligence and Industry Liberty of Conscience

William Bradford wrote our first American Christian Classic in his account of the Pilgrims. Since he was a teenager himself and took part in so many of the Pilgrim adventures, his book is a moving Christian testimony to that character which became a model for our nation. You can read an excerpt from the *History 'Of Plimoth Plantation'* in CHOC I* beginning on page 182, with a contrast between Pilgrims and Puritans.



4. Conscience is the Most Sacred of All Property T&L pp. 77-78;125-127; KEY: pp. 225-239

This statement by James Madison, Father of our Constitution, reflects our Biblical conviction that "we are the Workmanship" of God. We must have a

"conscience void of offence" to God and man. And, as John Locke wrote, "consent is our title to conscience".

We can teach this principle to our youngest child in these words found on page 230 of the KEY to this principle of Property:

I am God's Property God made me for His purpose; He fashioned me to be An image for His glory, Almighty Father He.

Our property is represented in our God-given talents and our use of them for the service of the Lord. We are also given the responsibility of stewardship—the care of all that God created. Property needs to be protected and preserved, as that is the "end and purpose of government". Only a Christian Constitutional Republic can properly preserve our rights of conscience as well as the external property which we have produced.

In our American history, a turning point came when our Colonists took a firm stand for "No Taxation Without Representation".



5. The Christian Form of Our Government T&L pp. 79-81; 129-130; KEY: pp. 240-249

Both the Law and the Gospel are foundational to America's Christian constitutional form of government. Our founding generations looked to the

Bible for the principle of representation: Take you wise men, and understanding and known among you and I will make them rulers over you...Captains over thousands, and captains over hundreds, and captains over fifties, and captains tens, and officers among your tribes.

Read for yourself, CHOC I, pp. 249-251, how Pastor Thomas Hooker preached a sermon on these verses and this produced America's first Constitution, known as the Fundamental Orders of Connecticut.

The Separation of Powers, or the Legislative, Executive and Judicial aspects of our governmental action, is found in Isaiah 33:22, "For the Lord is our judge, the Lord is our lawgiver, the Lord is our king."

How do we teach these principles of government to our youngest children? Government begins with individual action. When the individual child or adult Christian plans some action—perhaps it is as simple as coming home from school or taking a vacation—he or she is in effect legislating. Putting a plan into action is the executive function. And when we review our action, from both our internal conscience, or from the external law of the land, we are performing a judicial function (T&L p. 244).

Determining what area of government is the supreme law of the land, we consider the State and the Nation which operate over the same territory. If we consider the two commandments of our Lord, we shall recognize that the supreme law of the land is the nation first, then the state. Thus, when we travel outside our country, we are not protected as citizens because we are Virginians, Californians, Arizonians, but because we are Americans.

The Pastors of America preached in churches, in the halls of government in their election sermons, for the artillery companies, on fast days and days of Thanksgiving. They taught Biblical principles of self- and civil government. Oh, that we had such pastoral leadership today to clearly identify the force and power of government to be Christ in the life of the individual American.

of uniting the American Colonies "not by external but by the vital force of distinctive ideas and principles" (T&L p. 257). His Committees of Correspondence prepared the Colonies to clearly understand Biblical principles of government so that they could take the proper action when principles were threatened.

Samuel Adams taught the principles of Liberty under Law, once again beginning in the Christian character of each American. He wrote: "While the People are virtuous, they cannot be subdued; but when once they lose their Virtue they will be ready to surrender their Liberties to the first external or internal Invader.... If Virtue and Knowledge are diffused among the People, they will never be enslaved. This will be their great Security" (T&L p. 251).

Consistent with the Biblical principle that action begins within, our nation came

together internally, two years before we declared our Independence as a separate nation under God. The occasion was the punitive action which England took against Boston, because the tea was dumped into the harbor in 1773—the well-known Boston Tea Party.

England discounted the Biblical education of our American Colonies. She thought when she closed the Port of Boston December 3, 1774, that the other colonies would take advantage of Boston's economic distress and grasp her trade. But instead, they began with a Day of Fasting and Prayer throughout the colonies. After that, each of the other colonies sent aid to Boston. They gave not only prayer support, but sent food and other assistance, so that Boston could endure her economic trial. This outpouring of love helped emphasize the internal unity. Externally, each colony appointed delegates to a First Continental Congress so that they might together determine their united action. American Unity is Christian Unity.

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


