

What Will Happen at Christmas?

Well, we'll celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, but will that celebration include Christmas Mass with a congregation? I don't know - I don't even know if anyone knows at this stage. We're at Level 5 where church/synagogue/mosque services are on-line only, and the same is true for Level 4 and Level 3. At Level 2 congregations of up to 50 are allowed, and at Level 1 congregations of up to 100.

The Tablet, a UK Catholic weekly, had an interesting letter in the 31 October issue:

This weekend I weep as some members of our hierarchy, urging Catholics to return to church buildings and ignore the Covid threat, drew a parallel with the bravery of the English martyrs. I have never left Mass (online for me) so upset.

The Eucharist is indeed a deep longing for me, but sadly has not been offered in many places outdoors. Presumably wind and rain are more difficult to face than Covid-19. If I, or you, or anyone else catches the virus we are quite likely to kill others as we spread it. I do not think Jesus would ask us to do this.

God created us to use science to understand our world and protect our people. May we pray together for an end to this pandemic, but meanwhile act in community to slow its spread. Let us find safe ways of sharing the Eucharist rather than a return to what was before.
