### Advent - a joyful time of waiting for the Lord's coming.

Dear parishioners and visitors of Holy Spirit Parish & Christ the King Mission:

Last weekend, we began the beautiful season of Advent. It is a time to prepare our souls and hearts for the birth of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. The word advent comes from the Latin word "adventus", which means coming. For the ancient Romans, this word meant the official arrival of Caesar and a special time for the city. The Advent Mass readings tell us of the dramatic exhortations of the prophets, who encourage conversion, emphasize the impending end of time, and speak of the final advent of God's kingdom. At the same time, the Church will remind us of the hope associated with Parousia, that is, the second coming of Christ. The color for the Priestly vestments during Advent is purple. This color was created from a mixture of blue and red, which adequately expresses the spiritual and the carnal, as purple represents the struggle between the spirit and the body. The exception will be the 3rd Sunday of Advent, or Gaudete, when the color of the vestments will be rose. That color expresses the advantage of light and thus the closeness of Christmas. The liturgy of Advent will show us great figures, such as the prophet Isaiah and St. John the Baptist. John the Baptist will teach us how to prepare for the coming of the Lord through repentance, breaking away from our sins, rising from our addictions, and transforming us from an old man into a new one, by following the example of Christ Himself. This holy season of Advent is a reminder of the truth that Christ will come a second time to end the history of the world with the glory of the resurrection of the dead. Jesus said many times in the Bible: "I will come again and take you home, so that you may also be where I am" (Jn 14:3).

Dear friends of Christ, I wish for each of you that this time of Advent will be a time of motivation and renovation of your spirituality. That this Christmas, with pure hearts, you will be able to welcome the Baby Jesus into your life and your family. As you know, Advent is also a time of conversion and renewal of our broken hearts by sin, in the Sacrament of Confession. That's why we will have an Advent Penance Service at Holy Spirit Church in Vancleave on Thursday, December 16, at 6:00 p.m. Do not keep your soul in the darkness of sin

any longer. Repent and look for help, forgiveness, mercy, guidance, and the light of Christ in Confession. Of course, the most beautiful and brightest light for us Christians, is the Mother of God. She is the bright dawn rising in the morning, which will help us on our journey to Heaven. We especially love Her during Advent, as she is the biblical rainbow that announces reconciliation, an end to anger and punishment. She was the chosen one to be the Mother of the Savior, and She bore for us the Light, the King of the Universe, who will save us all on the last day. May the experience of Advent bring us all closer to the final destination of our faith, which is Heaven, so that filled with His graces we may go through life towards His eternal happiness.
