From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

In the Gospel today, we hear that people were impressed that Jesus taught with authority. I want to reflect today what is the meaning of that word and why it impressed the people that heard him. First, the way that a rabbi taught in Jesus' time was by quoting other rabbi's saying and tying it together – it was called “stringing a teaching”. Jesus, however, did not use that technique but directly proclaimed as a prophet (the one who was going to be sent that we read in the first reading) the word and the teaching. Second, the Greek word used to describe how Jesus spoke is “parrhesia”, which Merriam-Webster defines it as boldness or freedom of speech. This is very important because when one is teaching or announcing some news, it means that some people are not going to like it and you have to risk getting them annoyed or even mad at you for this. To have “parrhesia” calls for an internal freedom from affections and fears that only one who has the Spirit of Christ is able. Jesus speaks boldly because he knows his Father in Heaven is with him and will not abandon him. This freedom impressed the people who heard him; he broke the tradition of “stringing a teaching” and spoke without fear for the truth. This is a call of conversion for all of us. Many times, we do not speak boldly of what Jesus Christ through the Church teaches. This could be out of fear of losing face or affections and thus we are “cowards”. It might sound harsh, but it is a call to remember that the Truth that God has entrusted to us needs to be spoken boldly and without fear. Christ is Lord! Thus, what He taught us is the Truth, and this in every field – abortion, money, society, marriage, virginity, etc. I invite you to have “parrhesia” in your life and proclaim Christ every day, especially with your life. My dear parishioners, I invite you to support the mission of our Church and for this we depend on the generosity of the disciples. I hope we all participate, even the widow in the Gospel had something to contribute. Our goal is \$ 19,811. Let us pray for each other every day. Saint Francis de Sales Pray for Us!

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

En el Evangelio de hoy, escuchamos que la gente quedó impresionada de que Jesús enseñara con autoridad. Quiero reflexionar hoy cuál es el significado de esa palabra y por qué impresionó a la gente que lo escuchó. Primero, la forma en que un rabino enseñaba en la época de Jesús era citando el dicho de otro rabino y uniéndolo, se llamaba “entrelazar la enseñanza”. Jesús, sin embargo, no utilizó esa técnica, sino que proclamó directamente como profeta (el que iba a ser enviado que leímos en la primera lectura) la palabra y la enseñanza. En segundo lugar, la palabra griega utilizada para describir cómo habló Jesús es “parresia”, que Merriam-Webster la define como audacia o libertad de expresión. Esto es muy importante porque cuando uno está enseñando o anunciando alguna noticia, significa que a algunas personas no les va a gustar y tienes que arriesgarte a que se molesten o incluso se enojen contigo por esto. Tener “parresia” requiere una liberación interna de los afectos y temores que solo quien tiene el Espíritu de Cristo es capaz. Jesús habla con valentía porque sabe que su Padre Celestial está con él y no lo abandonará. Esta libertad impresionó a la gente que lo escuchó; rompió la tradición de “entrelazar la enseñanza” y habló sin temor por la verdad. Este es un llamado a la conversión para todos nosotros. Muchas veces, no hablamos con valentía de lo que enseña Jesucristo a través de la Iglesia. Esto podría ser por miedo a perder la cara o los afectos y por eso somos “cobardes”. Puede sonar duro, pero es un llamado a recordar que la Verdad que Dios nos ha confiado debe ser dicha con valentía y sin miedo. ¡Cristo es el Señor! Entonces, lo que nos enseñó es la Verdad, y esto en todos los campos: aborto, dinero, sociedad, matrimonio, virginidad, etc. Te invito a tener “parresia” en tu vida y proclamar a Cristo todos los días, especialmente con tu vida. Mis queridos feligreses, los invito a apoyar la misión de nuestra Iglesia y para ello dependemos de la generosidad de los discípulos. Espero que todos participemos, incluso la viuda del Evangelio tuvo algo que aportar. Nuestra meta es \$ 19,811. Oremos los unos por los otros todos los días. ¡San Francisco de Sales ¡Ruega por nosotros!

Caros irmãos e irmãs

No Evangelho de hoje, ouvimos que as pessoas ficaram impressionadas com o fato de Jesus ter ensinado com autoridade. Quero refletir hoje qual é o significado dessa palavra e porque impressionou as pessoas que o ouviram. Primeiro, a maneira como um rabino ensinava na época de Jesus era citando o ditado de outro rabino e amarrando-o - era chamado de “amarrar um ensino”. Jesus, porém, não usou essa técnica, mas proclamou diretamente como profeta (aquele que seria enviado que lemos na primeira leitura) a palavra e o ensino. Em segundo lugar, a palavra grega usada para descrever como Jesus falou é “parrhesia”, que Merriam-Webster define como ousadia ou liberdade de expressão. Isso é muito importante porque quando alguém está ensinando ou anunciando uma notícia, significa que algumas pessoas não vão gostar e você corre o risco de deixá-las irritadas ou até bravas com você por isso. Ter “parrhesia” exige uma liberdade interna das afeições e medos de que só quem tem o Espírito de Cristo é capaz. Jesus fala com ousadia porque sabe que seu Pai Celestial está com ele e não o abandonará. Essa liberdade impressionou as pessoas que o ouviram; ele quebrou a tradição de “amarrar um ensinamento” e falou sem temer a verdade. Este é um apelo de conversão para todos nós. Muitas vezes, não falamos com ousadia sobre o que Jesus Cristo ensina por meio da Igreja. Pode ser por medo de perder prestígio ou afeto e por isso somos “covardes”. Pode soar duro, mas é um chamado para lembrar que a Verdade que Deus nos confiou precisa ser falada com ousadia e sem medo. Cristo é o Senhor! Assim, o que Ele nos ensinou é a Verdade, e isto em todos os campos - aborto, dinheiro, sociedade, casamento, virgindade, etc. Convido-os a ter “parrhesia” na sua vida e a anunciar Cristo todos os dias, especialmente com a sua vida. Caros paroquianos, convido-os a apoiar a missão da nossa Igreja e para isso contamos com a generosidade dos discípulos. Espero que todos participemos, até a viúva do Evangelho tinha algo a contribuir. Nossa meta é \$ 19.811. Vamos orar uns pelos outros todos os dias. São Francisco de Sales ora por nós!
