Life Goes On At The BSRC

The BSRC continues to enjoy a variety of gatherings and events. We went into the holiday season with a wonderful candlelight dinner in early December, which included an inspirational presentation of Scriptures and Hymns, as well as a scrumptious Christmas feast. Both events included not just residents, but brethren from the local area. We enjoyed several lunch outings, some to familiar places and others to new ones. Monthly Hymn singing continues to be a big blessing and well attended.

Moving forward to March much has changed. Due to the Covid-19 virus, we had to make some adjustments.

We had to suspend Scrabble, our monthly witness activity and lunch outings due to the 6-feet of separation requirements and restaurants being closed. We continue to raise our voices heavenward, with the monthly Hymn fest and still study the Manna at Harmony Hour each week. Lunch is now served similar to your local restaurant. Meals are plated and seating follows the 6-foot guideline. Fellowship continues to be a highlight and a tonic to the brethren. We are looking forward to the Lord's Providences, now more than ever, and thankful for our Lord's guiding hand. The Center may be going through some challenges but the brethren trust the Lord and are strong in their faith. The Son is shining in our hearts.

Planning and Construction Report

In December, 2019 the BSRC received 3 bids for a new elevator and steel stairs for C and F buildings. The bids ranged from \$600,000 to 800,000 which far exceeded available funds. The low bidder was contacted in an effort to "value engineer" the project to more closely approximate funds. The low bidder was presented with a reduced scope that consisted of a single elevator shaft attached to Bldg F and the deletion of new steel stairs. The result was a reduced price of \$265,000. No further efforts were made to pursue the bidder at this level of cost.

The Committee then set out to investigate other means of accomplishing the task of getting an elevator within the budget. Br. Ed Heidelbach pursued this effort until he reached a contact who actually installed the original lift at the BSRC twenty years ago. His company, Elite Lift & Elevator, after several visits to the BSRC and conversations with Br Ed, provided a price of approximately \$130,000 for a LULA (limited use limited application) elevator connected to the north side of Bldg F. Elite will be provided with a contract to proceed at the negotiated price. Elite will provide new drawings and specifications for construction and obtain the required building permits.

It was necessary to delete the new steel stairs from the project so the elevator could go forward. This work will be postponed until a later date and the existing stairs will be reinforced and maintained as needed for safety. During the elevator discussions it became obvious that an additional means of mechanical egress (vertical transport) was needed if the existing lift was to be taken out of service. This gave rise to the consideration of a chair lift mounted to a rail fastened to the stairs on the south side of C Bldg. However, the chair lift will not be needed in the latest elevator proposal.

Reports of damage to fascia boards, the lack of proper drip edge on the Main House and deteriorated roofing shingles on Buildings A & B were provided to the Board. New roofs for Buildings A & B and new gutters and flashing for the Main House will be provided. Our Operations Manager, Sr. Arleen Battaglia secured bids from 4 roofing contractors and are under advisement to the Board.

Our dear Br. Bob Wilson was born in Ithaca, NY June 30, 1926. He attended high school in California and college in Allentown, PA before serving in the Army Air Corps at the end of World War II. He came back to work as a Park Ranger in Yosemite National Park where he met and married Virginia in 1948. They lived in a forest rangers cabin in the Yosemite back country until their son Kirk came along when they moved down to Fresno where they lived for 60 years. There he worked as a life insurance salesman for 15 years then as a public affairs officer at the Naval Air Station for another 15 years. Br. Bob and Sr. Virginia, or "Jinny" as she is affectionately called, were avid backpackers and would spend weeks backpacking in the Sierra Nevada Mountains and of course, Yosemite National Park.

Br. Bob learned the Truth from his mother and made it his own in 1955. He was an active member of the Fresno, CA class for 55 years and for 45 of those years served as a deacon and an elder. Br. Bob and Sr. Jinny manned the Bible Students booth at the Kings County Fairgrounds in Hanford, CA and worked in the summers at the Dawn in New Jersey for many years. They traveled to many conventions around the country and Europe. Br. Bob served in many locations worldwide including in Africa as part of the Bible Students African Committee.

In 2010 Br. Bob and Sr. Jinny moved to the BSRC where Br. Bob previously served as a Board member for 12 years. He later served as the Resident Director from 2011 to 2014. Br. Bob's last words of advice were "God is faithful as promised... so keep the faith." I came on the Board just 3 years ago and really got to know and appreciate Br. Bob while visiting. Br. Bob made me realize that everyone at the Center has a story. And, unless you take the time to get to know your brethren, by sitting down and visiting with them, you'll miss out on hearing some of the most incredible stories and experiences, experiences that eventually led them,



in the Lords providence, to the BSRC. When I heard of Br. Bob's change on January 16, 2020 at the age of 93 I was saddened, not because of his change, but because I wouldn't have the opportunity to sit down with him to hear another story. 
