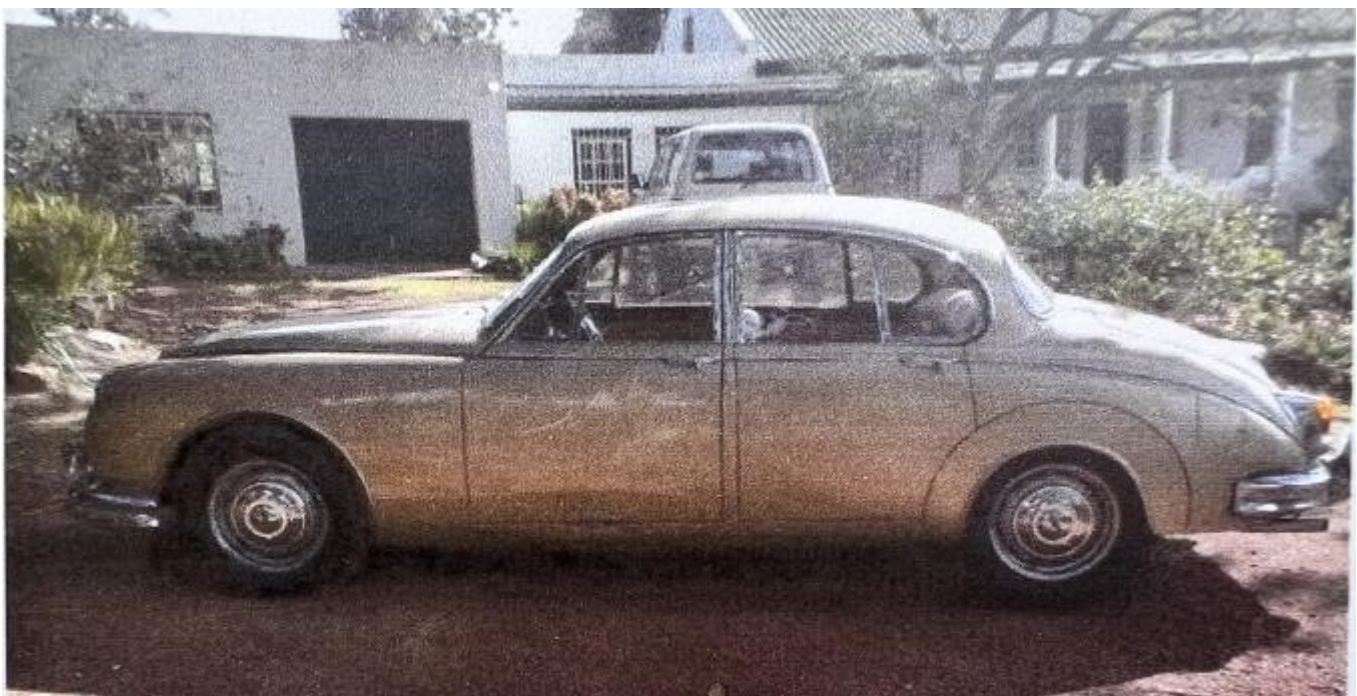

In my lifetime, 2 trips to UK, a trip to Europe, a trip to USA, a trip to South Africa and a trip to good, old Russia. Drive around Nuremberg Ring was a highlight.

Is it the end? Who knows! If I ever work out how long the piece of string is, I will know.

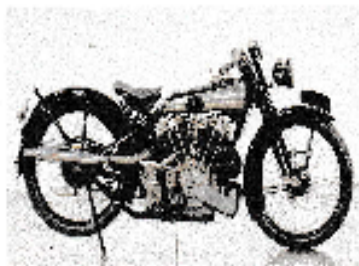
