+ A recent post at a local tax preparer Facebook group led me to this CROSSLINK News item from the end of April that reminds us of "2016 Changes to EITC, Child Tax and Education Credits, and 2017 Filing Season Refund Delays for <u>Returns with EITC</u>".

The item emphasizes " the coming important changes to the preparer due diligence requirements, refundable credits, and refunds for the 2017 filing season".

These changes are a response by the idiots in Congress to the excessive tax fraud that refundable tax credits create. The solution to this tax fraud is not to continue to force tax preparers to become Social Workers, but do remove refundable credits from the Tax Code!

+ From a Checkpoint Newsstand daily email newsletter early in June – "IRS summarizes current rules for federal tax return preparers, encourages AFSP status".

I find the voluntary AFSP program to be of no value to tax pros. I have not yet heard from a fellow preparer who has gained a single client from being listed in the IRS database of "approved" preparers. This program is truly a waste of the IRS already limited budget.

A voluntary credential for those who do not want to engage in representation is truly needed. Getting a credential from <u>ACAT</u> is a much better voluntary choice than the AFSP.

I would be interested in hearing from tax pros who "volunteered" for AFSP as to whether they felt it provided any value to their practice.
