Christmas has passed without the presence of members of family and friends who could not visit safely. We are thankful that we were able to make sacrifices to keep others safe. Our online Carol Service as you know was a great success. I thank all those who had a hand in making it such a success. Since last writing there was much debate about managing Christmas services. I regret that our smaller churches had to remain closed because of the numbers who normally attend the Festival services. As it turned out Christmas Eve proved unpopular for whatever reason and we had sufficient space in Nicholas' to observe protocols. A few days before Christmas we were notified that all churches in the Republic would close on 26th January except for private prayer, so the united service, planned for 27th December, in St Nicholas' had to be cancelled. The service in Creggan parish church can take place as scheduled on 3rd January. There will also be a rural deanery on-line service on 3rd of January and some form of on-line services will be arranged for the other Sundays in January. During lockdown we shouldn't discard our diaries. We need to plan for ordinary activities each week: simple things like a special home meal, a favourite walk, a film evening, phoning.... the list goes on. Please pass on ideas to me and to others, preferably by email. I am happy to watch St Nicholas' WhatsApp without comment. Vaccinations are being rolled out as I write, so if we can observe the protocols for another couple of months, we can hope for a new normal minus many things we didn't really need. Our prayers go out to those who lost loved ones, to those who are isolated, to business owners who had to close down, to the people who lost their jobs, and to the young people who missed out on so much of what they would normally do at this stage in their lives.

As I look out of our study window this last morning of 2020 the sun is shining on a light covering of snow I wish you God's blessing for a brighter and healthy new year.


