



2022 Arizona Mustang & Burro Expo Open Show

Rules & Important Info: Please read every point before asking questions. Thank you!

- All patterns will be posted Saturday morning at the announcer's booth and copies at check in.
- There are no cross entering same rider/equine into In-Hand, WT or WTL divisions.
- Anyone competing in Gymkhana classes may not enter In-Hand or WT divisions with same equine.
- Division Key: JY – Junior Youth (ages 8-12yrs), Y- Youth (ages 13-17yrs), I – In-Hand, B – Burro, WT – Walk/Trot, WTL – Walk, Trot, Lope, G – Gymkhana
- Rider/handler may wear Western or English clothing and tack.
- Same equine may only be used for no more than two separate divisions.
- Classes with \$ next to it are jackpot classes. They cost \$20 to enter and \$10 will go into a purse paid out to top 5 placings 100%. 1st place – 50%, 2nd place – 20%, 3rd place – 15%, 4th place – 10% and 5th place – 5%.
- Ribbons to 5th place in each class.
- High Point Ribbons to High Point Divisions – Junior Youth, Youth, Burro, In-Hand, Walk/Trot, Walk/Trot/Lope and Gymkhana.
- Classes are \$10 each other than jackpot classes which are \$20 each.
- You must book your own stall with facility management. Day haul in's welcome.
- Youth 17yrs and under must wear a helmet when riding.
- Check in's start Saturday morning at 7am. Must sign a liability release to compete. Must be paid in full to compete.
- Placings announced at end of each class and ribbons passed out. Monies paid out and highpoint awards at end of show.

Class List and Descriptions

Saturday May 7, 2022

Start time approx. 1PM after TIP Challenge awards

1. Lead Line (ages 10 and under [rider], handler can be any age, does not count towards highpoint)
2. \$Lead Line Showmanship – handler with rider (any rider, any age or stuffed toy works too) to complete showmanship pattern. Points go towards highpoint for both handler and rider. Highpoint divisions who may enter: JY, Y, I, B, WT, WTL.
3. Showmanship – handler and equine will complete showmanship pattern
4. Walk/Trot Equitation – Under saddle rail class where rider is judged on their equitation.
5. Walk/Trot/Lope Equitation – Under Saddle rail class where rider is judged on equitation.
6. Walk/Trot Pleasure – Under saddle rail class where equine is judged primarily
7. Walk/Trot/Lope Pleasure – Under saddle rail class where equine is judged primarily.
8. Discipline Rail – W/T/L class where riders are asked to do different maneuvers in a simon says format.
9. \$Reining – beginner reining pattern
10. Walk/Trot Ranch Riding – ranch riding pattern
11. Walk/Trot/Lope Ranch Riding – ranch riding pattern

Sunday May 8, 2022

Start time approx. 1pm after TIP Challenge awards

12. \$Costume
13. In-Hand Trail (sign up for trail order will be at announcer's booth)
14. Walk/Trot Trail (sign up for trail order will be at announcer's booth)
15. Burro Trail (sign up for trail order will be at announcer's booth)
16. Walk/Trot Hunter Hack – two small cross rails set up with pattern, must maintain trot
17. Walk/Trot/Lope Hunter Hack – two small cross rails set up with pattern
18. \$Timed Trail – must navigate obstacles and maintain gaits posted in pattern plus have fastest time. Breaking gait and difficulty with obstacles will result in time penalties. 10 seconds per gait break and 5 seconds for obstacle difficulty. Three refusals will be a disqualification.
19. \$Barrel Racing – fastest time of clover leaf pattern
20. \$Pole Bending – fastest time, run up, serpentine around poles back and up, run back.
21. \$Flag Grab – run down to flag, grab flag, go around barrel and run back.
