- ★ *How to Build Isabel's Bedroom* instruction pages

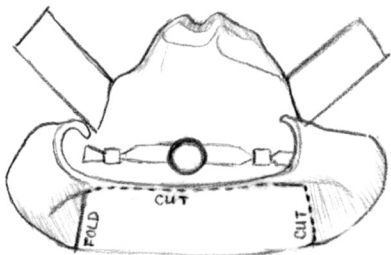

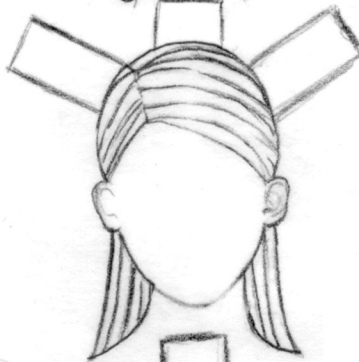
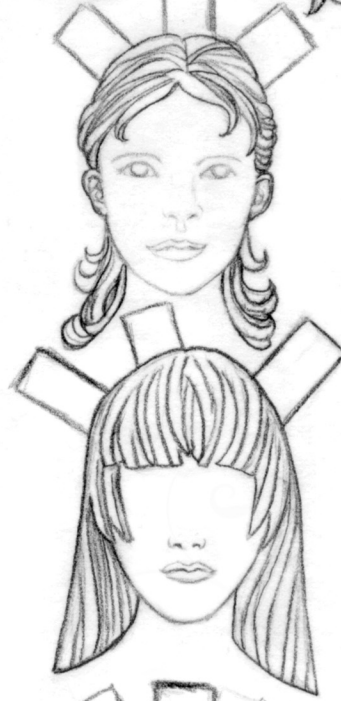
1. Draw her face

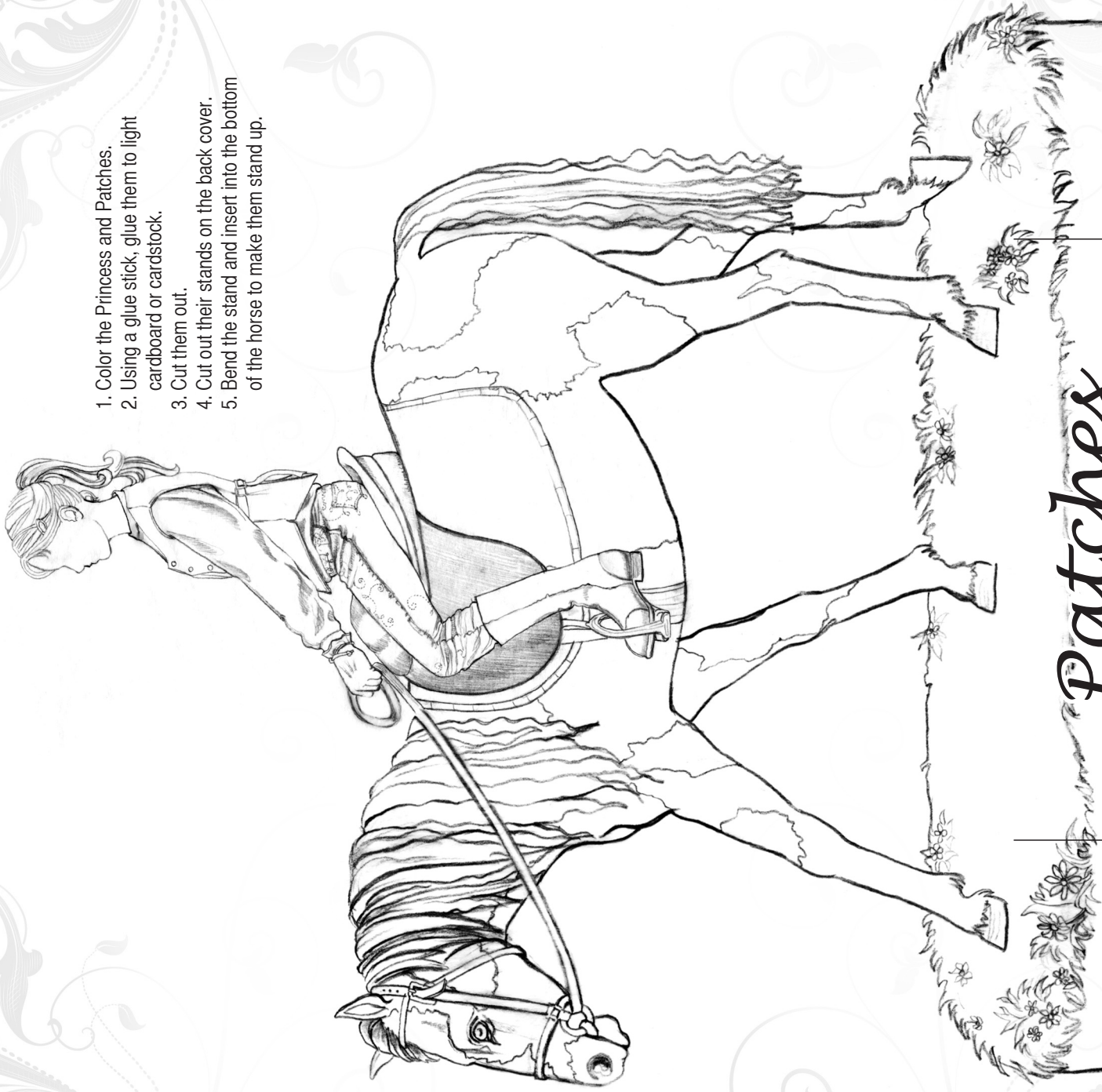


1. Color Isabel and Starlight.

5. Bend the stand and insert into the bottom of the horse to make them stand up.



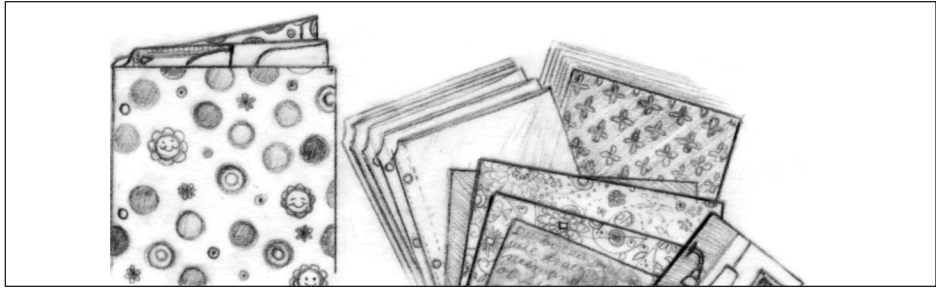

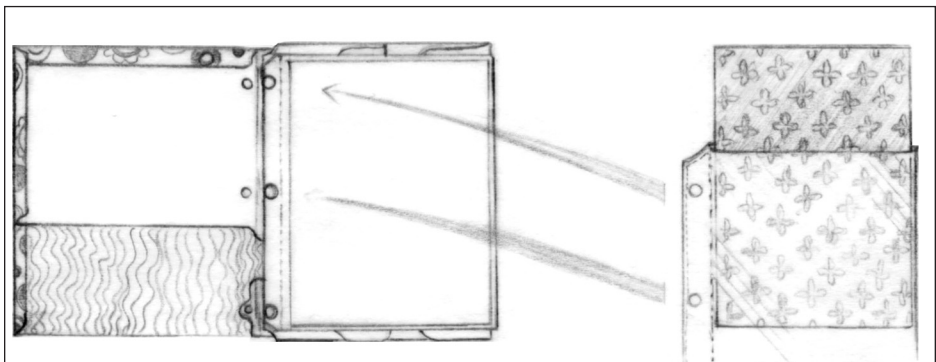
Building a Closet and Bedroom for Isabel

1. Gather together:

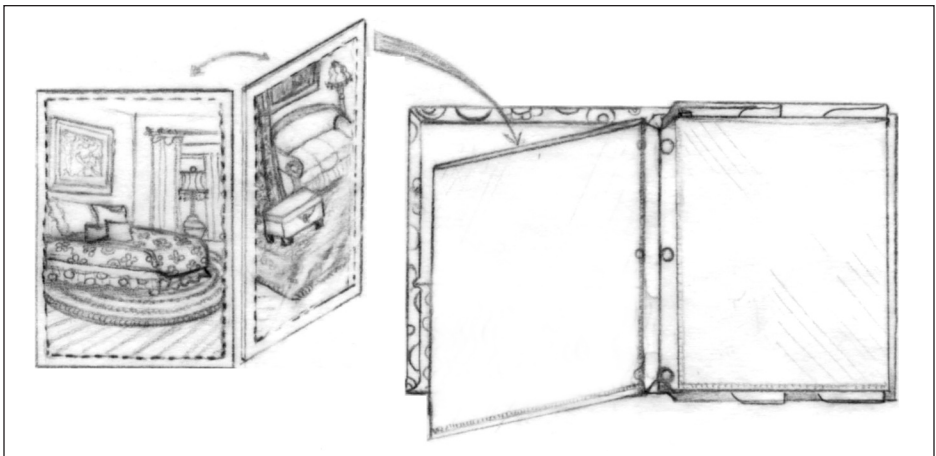
- * Your fun folder
- * 4-6 plastic sleeves that open on top
- * 8-10 pieces of solid card stock any color you like 8.5 x 11 or 4-6 fun designed scrap booking papers same size
- * Department store magazines that have pictures of furniture in them
- * Glue stick and scissors



2. Slip the cardstock or papers into the top of the plastic sleeves. This will serve as a background for the closet. Leave one or two plastic sleeves empty.

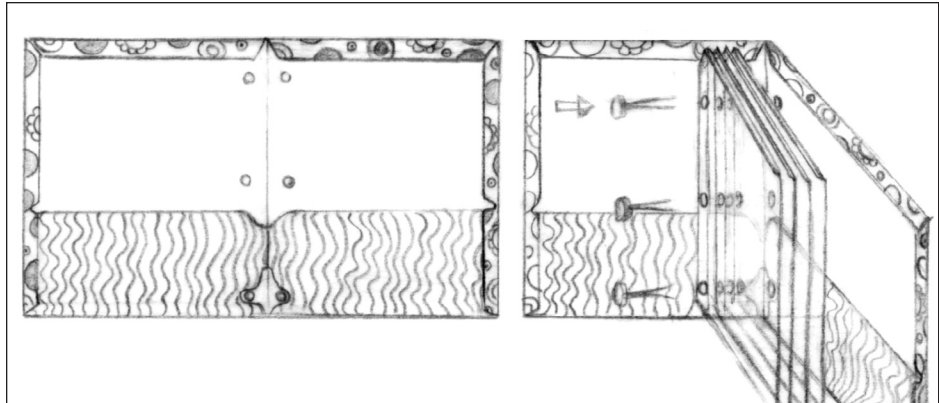


3. Cut out pictures of bedroom furniture from a magazine and glue them on a piece of 8.5 x 11 card stock and slip into one of the plastic covers. You can make a living room, too and slip it on the other side. By turning the page, you can be in another room.

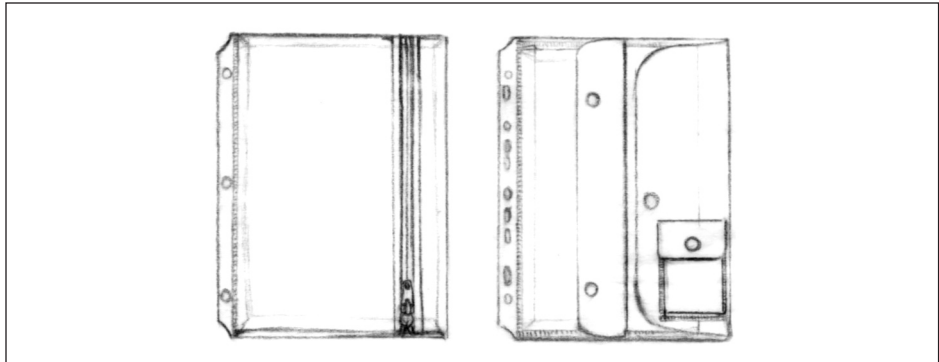

4. Fasten the plastic sleeves into the middle of your folder. Store the clothes you make inside the plastic sleeves.



5. For extra fun, you can add a plastic page with a zipper compartment or snap pockets.
