September Meeting

When: October12, 2016

Where: DSU, Udvar Hazy Building, Room 121, 7 PM

Why: Dr. Kevin Rafferty, Chairman, Department of Human Behavior College of Southern Nevada will speak on "Archaeological Survey in Valley of Fire: Training Students and Deducing a Settlement Pattern Model for Valley of Fire in Southern Nevada"

The archaeological program at the College of Southern Nevada (CSN) has been conducting archaeological survey and site recording in Valley of Fire State park since 2003. This has resulted in the inventory of over 5 square miles of the southern portion and the recording, or re-recording, of nearly 100 archaeological sites in the park. These range in age from the Lake Mojave period (ca. 10,000-7500 B.P.) to 20th century phenomena. Over 60 students have been exposed to the best practices in inventory and recording techniques. This effort has also allowed for the construction of an area-specific culture history based on the results of the surveys. This talk will discuss the different survey effort by year and result, and present a model of prehistoric settlement and subsistence that will hopefully be tested by future researchers in the area. Here is a short bio if you wish to use it. Dr. Kevin Rafferty has been an archaeologist for over 40 years, with 35+ of those years being spent conducting research in the Great Basin and eastern Mojave Desert. He has been at the College of Southern Nevada for 28 years and has been proud to have had a part in training and teaching numerous students, and sending a number of them to four year schools and to jobs in the contract archaeology
