**<u>ST. JOHN'S SEMINARY, WONERSH</u>** This past week we have heard the news that St John's Seminary in Wonersh is to close in its present form. The Seminary has served the Church for 130 years and there is great sadness that formation must now end at the site.

Unfortunately there was no new intake this September. With the seminarian body numbering just 17 the community is small, with the building and staffing costs too high to sustain. Arrangements have been made for the remaining seminarians to join the community at Allen Hall, Chelsea in Sept 2021.

Archbishop John Wilson and Bishop Richard are committed to providing priestly formation that will serve the people of our Dioceses and parishes into the future. St John's will remain a legal entity so that consideration can be given to the ways in which the tradition of priestly formation established at Wonersh in 1891 will continue.

The Trustees of St John's are extremely grateful to rectors, staff and seminarians, past and present, and to all those who have supported the Seminary over the years. We ask our Diocesan church family to pray for vocations to the priesthood, keeping our seminarians in their thoughts and prayers over the coming months.

# <u>The Holy Father's Monthly Intention for November</u> <u>Artificial Intelligence</u>

We pray that the progress of robotics and artificial intelligence may always serve humankind.

Saint Columban – the dove of Christ – brought *true Christianity* back to Europe and especially northern Italy after the fall of the Roman Empire. The name means *dove* or *little dove* in Latin.
Columbanus was an Irish missionary notable for founding a number of monasteries after 590 in the Frankish and Lombard kingdoms, most notably Luxeuil Abbey in present-day France and Bobbio Abbey in present-day Italy. He was one of those many Irish missionaries who kept the faith alive in Western Europe during the time after the destruction of Rome, now known as The Dark Ages.
Irish missionaries were crucial figures in the spread of Christianity in Anglo-Saxon England during the 6th and 7th centuries In many respects, he was the greatest, bravest, most thoroughly

national, and most representative of all the warriors of the cross sent forth from Irish shores. Born in Leinster, A.D. 543, he was educated first of all on one of the islands of Lough Erne,
