- o Meeting opened with Liz reading from Revelations a scripture describing "The Church is a place..."
- Pastor Paul had no report.
- Minutes from the previous meeting, Nov 14, 2019, were reviewed and approved. Communications received were read and shared with the Council.
- Treasurer, Carla Ingalls, was not present but the November 2019 report was available for review and discussion.
 Motion by Bonnie to accept/approve the report, second by Cheri. Approved
- Finance Committee discussion led by Bonnie, regarding the 4th quarter of 2019 report to congregation. Decision was to give this report on the first Sunday of January, 2020.
- SPRC Cheri announced that Jennifer Heidtke, Administrative Assistant, in the church office will be leaving this
 position. This will be announced in all three churches on Sunday, December 8th. Cheri will make this announcement

This will be for 6 children ranging in age from 2 12 years. These need to be delivered by December 18th. Motion by Cheri/second Liz to do these three families.

Missions Committee Meeting Minutes

December 5th, 2019 at 3:45pm

Present: Mary & Jim Beede, Liz Dempsey, Pastor Paul Messmer, Cheryl Bingham

Reviewed old & new business, including:

- Email received from Carla Ingalls regarding the Supporting Our Students collection. In addition to all the items donated for Lake Holcombe School (pants, socks, underwear, notebooks, pencils, kleenex, antiseptic wipes, etc.) we received \$258 in monetary donations. She has opened a line-item listing on her reports for Missions. The \$258 plus a previous \$50 gift, from a Camaraderie Club breakfast hosted at church, brings the balance to \$308. She asked that we share this with the Ad Board. Group also decided to have Cheryl share this information with the congregation on 12/8. We are so blessed to have such a supportive congregation!
- Approved reimbursing Cheryl \$168 for purchases made & shipping of packages to college students.
- We still would like to purchase some small shoes as requested by the school, as these were not donated. Cheryl will check on purchasing these for the group, using part of the funds collected.
- Discussed our HUMC Missionary covenant agreement. The recent agreement was for Rev. Paul Webster but decision made last month, and per discussion with Rev. Webster, to now have this go to Rev. Temba Nkomopezi (agriculture program) who has taken over the role. We discussed & opted to list Betty Tshala (nutrition program) as an alternate, to help ensure that our support goes to one of the Board of Global Ministry missionaries working at Mujila Falls. The Covenant form will be sent to Carla for completion & payment of support.
- Pastor Paul reported that Jennifer is planning a Christmas Family collection. She has information regarding 3 families. She has let the school know that our church will be collecting for 2 families (children ages 8, 2 & 5), and possibly adding the third family that still needs a sponsor. Our group opted to wait on adding a third family, pending approval of the Ad Board which was meeting immediately after our meeting.
- We are planning to have a "warm socks" collection in January.
- We will have new members hopefully joining the Missions Committee in January. At the January
 meeting we will need to set goals & schedule for the year, along with setting the day & time of
 meetings that works for all members.
