Crafting Document Belts and Pennants out of 18" Foamies by Elsa Pla

End Products:


12 Document Belts (to secure reams of student work, etc)
24 Pennants (for classroom displays -- ideas at the end)


Materials:

pack of 12 2mm 18" Foamies, assorted colors (~\$8.00) 2 packs of 12 adhesive Velcro squares (~\$3.50 ea.) one 18" sheet of paper (same size as Foamies) wax-based color pencil in a dark color long ruler scissors removable (Post-it) labels for belts (optional) decorations for pennants vinyl lacing (10 yds) for pennants (~\$1.00)

Steps for One Foamie:

1- a) Use the sheet of paper to create the following template for a belt and two pennants. The belt should be as long as possible. Start with a diagonal line. Then add two parallel lines, each $1\frac{1}{2}$ " from the diagonal. Width of belt: ~ 3"; length of sides of pennants: ~ 15". b) Then cut out the shapes.







2- Use the paper shapes to help you transfer the template onto the Foamie. (Use the wax pencil to draw the lines on the Foamie.)



- 3- Cut out the shapes and trim (if necessary) the belt and pennants. (Remember to make the belt as long as possible.)
- 4- Document Belt: <u>Carefully</u> adhere the Velcro strips to the ends of the belt as shown. Optional: use removable labels to identify your documents.







5- Pennants: Punch out holes for the vinyl lacing and decorate.



Ideas for Pennants

- 1- Use them to spell important words.

 Example: The Three R's: RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY, RIGOR
- 2- Use them to represent individual students or student groups.
- 3- Use them to keep track of student or group goals.

If you want kids to decorate their own pennants, I suggest you cut out pennants out of construction paper and have students decorate those instead, then tape or glue the decorated construction-paper pennants to the Foamies.
