Class includes hands on instruction of material usage and design in building a beautiful, small, load-bearing Straw Bale building with a gravel bag foundation and living roof.

We will use gravel in the bags as the floating foundation on a trench of rubble over a French drain. Gravel bags are a good, inexpensive alternative to pouring a concrete foundation stem wall. A French drain with floating foundation is a low cost, tried-and-true method for house stability.

Building with straw, rock and earth meets the standard for sustainability, with low-impact, nontoxic, low-embodied energy and the potential for using simple construction techniques. Straw is a waste by-product of wheat production, and using locally grown baled straw helps local farmers.

Depending if you choose to attend all three sessions, this hands-on workshop will consist of:

- Construction of an earth and bag trench foundation with French drain (**Session 1**);
- Cutting and re-tying bales (**Session 2**);
- Building bale walls building, squaring up and securing;
- Constructing the wall cap and roof, some earth plastering.
- Living roof (**Session 3**).

Each student attending Strawbale or Complete series will take home a copy of "Building Green"
