As I sit in the university library writing my assignment, I can't help but notice the worry and seriousness on my fellow students' faces. They all look so stressed out, working on their deadlines, revising for their tests, and researching. This isn't new; this is always almost the case every semester. I can't help but ask myself, is this is all there is to life? Getting a degree, finding a job, making a secure living? As I get older, I am more aware of the fact that responsibilities pile up followed by stress. The hours in the day seem so short and the 'To Do List' gets longer. And inevitably we all get so caught up in our worldly duties that we forget what our purpose in this life is.....to show complete submission to our Creator SWT. Allahu Akbar!

I love the beauty of our religion as it promotes both worldly duties as well as madhabi. But sadly most of us fail to balance both and become more lenient towards worldly concerns. • Allahumma infa'nii bimaa 'allamtani wa'allimni maa yanfa'unii. (O Allah! Make useful for me what you taught me and teach me knowledge that will be useful for me)

#### While studying something difficult

Allahumma la sahla illama ja 'althu sahlawwa anta taj'alul hazana itha sh'ita sahla.
 (O Allah! Nothing is easy except what you have made easy, if you wish, you can make the difficult easy)

#### After Studying

• Allahumma inni asta'eduka ma qara'tu ma ma hafazt. Faruddahu 'allaya inda hagati ilayh. (O Allah! I entrust you with what I have read. Bring it back to me when I am in need of it)

# Hadith-e-Dil



#### The Truth, The Whole Truth and Nothing but the Truth – by Jabeen Khan

Imam Bayhaqi (RA) from Jabir (RA) relates that the Messenger of Allah (Salallahu alaihi wasallam) said: "There is no charity more beloved to Allah from speaking the truth."

This Hadith was declared rigorously authentic by Ibn Hibban (RA). Not only does this Hadith place a high value on truth, stating that speaking the truth is a form of charity that is beloved to Allah SWT, but actually says that there is *nothing* more charitable. It is very important to always speak the truth, regardless of the effects, as speaking the truth is a vital part of Islam about which the Holy Quran and Hadith have guided us time and time again. Allah SWT loves those who speak the truth and those who always speak the truth are also respected by society at large. Lying not only creates problems in your life but is also considered a big sin in Islam.

Speaking the truth may cause some short time hardship, but saves you from the bigger trouble. Uttering one lie can lead to a vicious cycle; you may be forced to speak more lies to cover up the initial falsehood. So, speaking the truth is of paramount importance and forms the basis of good character. The Beloved Prophet (Salallahu alaihi wasallam) said truth takes you towards virtuous acts which lead you eventually towards Heaven. Abdullah bin Mas`ud (RA) reported that the Prophet (Salallahu alaihi wasallam) said:

"Truth leads to piety and piety leads to Jannah. A man persists in speaking the truth till he is enrolled with Allah as a truthful. Falsehood leads to vice and vice leads to the Fire (Hell), and a person persists on telling lies until he is enrolled as a liar". [Agreed upon Hadith]

In another Hadith narrated by Hazrat Abu Hurairah (RA), Nabi-e-Kareem (Salallahu alaihi wasallam) said: "Whoever does not give up false statements (i.e. telling lies) and evil deeds, and uttering bad words to others, Allah is not in need of his (fasting) leaving his food and drink." This is a clear indication of how the evil act of speaking lies is loathed by Allah Ta'ala, so much so that Allah Ta'ala will not accept our ibadah because of us telling lies.

In conclusion, telling lies is a terrible and grievous sin and it removes all the barakah from our lives. We must therefore, at all costs abstain from uttering falsities that will incur the Wrath of Allah SWT, and hence be to our detriment in this world and the hereafter.

May Allah grant us the tawfeeg to abstain from telling lies. Aameen!


