ADVENT 2: The Prophesied Dawn

Isaiah 8: 16 to 9: 6



Last week Matt shared his experience of being in total darkness in a cave in Derbyshire. I think Matt described the experience as being profound. But what if the lights had not come back on? I suspect that the profound darkness would soon be the cause of distress and maybe panic. What would you do? Would you dare even to move?

In our reading this morning, the People of Israel were in a dark place.

The ten northern tribes had been taken into captivity and the Assyrians were camped just 8 miles outside of Jerusalem, surrounding the remaining two tribes. They didn't know what to do and many of them even began to turn towards the ghosts of dead family members to seek advice but Isaiah says that this will only lead them deeper into darkness.

Isaiah makes his position very clear v 17 'I will wait for the Lord, who is hiding his face from the house of Jacob, and I will hope in him'. Isaiah had two children, two sons who had special names which were prophetic. The first he named Shear-jashub which means 'The remnant shall return.' And the second he named Maher-shalal-hash-baz, meaning "Hurry, O Spoil! He Has Made Haste to the Plunder." One speaks of a remnant, survivors returning. This has been a constant theme for the Jewish nation, a sign of God's faithfulness. The second name speaks of winning a battle: rushing to get the spoils and plunder is what victors do.

Isaiah's prophecy in chapter 9 speaks of the coming light, like the light of dawn and pinpoints exactly where it will start: Galilee, the very place where Jesus began his ministry. Isaiah said that the people would rejoice because the yoke from their backs and the bars from their shoulders and the rod of their oppressors would be removed. And when the light came, it would all happen suddenly like the day of Midian, when Gideon's whittleddown army of three hundred men smashed their covered lamps producing an explosion of light enabling them to rout the Midianites (Judges 7).

And all this was going to happen because of the birth of one child.

The child would have some amazing titles: Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. His name is Jesus and all authority rests upon his shoulders. He has authority over all sin and death, over everything that oppresses us and whatever causes the darkness in our lives.

Verse 7 speaks of the everlasting kingdom of God that Jesus preached about; an everlasting kingdom of justice and righteousness.

The great news for us from the prophet Isaiah is that Jesus was coming to explode God's light into the world's darkness, bringing wisdom, power, loving fatherhood, hope and peace.
