

<u>Italian Heritage</u> Best Hidden Gems in Italy

Calabria [Ca·la·bri·a) is the toe of Italy's boot and is a region in Southern Italy with incredible scenic beauty along the rugged Ionian, and Tyrrhenian seas, pristine beaches, and a substantial number of historical and archaeological sites. With almost two million residents across a total area of approximately 5,877 sq miles. Calabria has twelve cities and six provinces. It is one of the oldest regions of Italy with the first evidence of human presence in the region dating as far back as 700,000 years B.C. Over the centuries, various



cultures, including Spanish, Arabic, and Norman, have influenced the region's culture, language, and architecture.

It is the up-and-coming holiday destination in Italy. Calabria has been unaffected by mass tourism and remains developed. It has mountains, three national parks (Aspromonte, Pollino, and Sila), 500 miles of coastline, turquoise waters, and rolling, green hills lined with olive, orange, and lemon trees. Calabria is agriculturally rich, with Italy's second highest number of organic farmers after Sicily. Despite its small size and low population, Calabria is responsible for producing a third of all the olive oil products.



The clear blue waters of the Tyrrhenian and Ionian seas are among the cleanest in Europe and the sunsets are spectacular. The beaches rival those of the Caribbean.

For a livelier experience, look to the cities Reggio Calabria, Cosenza, and the regional capital, Catanzaro, which is centrally located and therefore ideal as a base for traveling around. Soverato on the east coast or Tropea on the west coast.



The town of **Tropea** is among the highlights of Calabria with a lovely cathedral and many shops selling traditional Calabrian pottery and agricultural products, bars, and scenic trattorias. There are stunning views across the Tyrrhenian to the **Stromboli volcano** and perched upon a rock at the foot of the town is the convent church of "Santa Maria dell' Isola" also known as

the "Coast of the Gods" a fourth century monastery that is accessible only by climbing up a winding flight of steps carved directly into the cliffside. Nearby **Pizzo** and **Capo Vaticano** offer a wide choice of excellent beaches.





The food of Calabria is simple: pastas and vegetables, complemented by olive oil and sausages. It combines the various shapes of dried pasta like spaghetti or penne topped with colorful sauces made with tomatoes, eggplant, and peppers. Additionally include spicy dried salami or other sausages such as pork sopressata or smoked capocollo andn'duija (hot pepper and pork spread of Spilinga) and you sum up the cuisine of Calabria. All these ingredients frequently make their way into hearty soups. Unique to Calabria is the frequent use of pepperoncino (hot, hot pepper) in many dishes on the Calabrian table.
