## An End of Island Life

The last inhabitants left the Great Blasket island in 1953: a young man died because weather conditions had made it impossible for him to get medical attention, and that prompted the evacuation.

The 5 September issue of The Tablet has an article reflection on life on the island, and Catholicism as part of that life.

There was no priest living on the island, so burials of islanders took place on the mainland, a three-mile journey in a currach. Babies were taken to Ballyferriter for baptism. Confirmations? Young teenagers stayed in Ballyferriter for up to a week before Confirmation: the journey across the sea was often impossible in winter and they wanted to ensure the weather didn't prevent them from being confirmed. Marriages, too, took place on the mainland.

The national school opened in 1864.

Once a year Mass was celebrated on the island : the stations". Only the men went to Sunday Mass on the mainland, the women and children remained on the island to say the rosary. Two boats were needed to pick up the clergy for the "stations", one for the parish priest and one for the curate and sacristan. That also was the time when you fasted from midnight if you were receiving Communion, and rowing boats to Dunquin and back was hard work.

Great Blasket stories are in Peig, in Twenty Years a-Growing and in The Islander. Changed times.
