In today's Gospel passage there is a gradual recognition of who Jesus is- first of all through the testimony of John the Baptist and the words of the first disciples. John the Baptist calls Jesus 'the Lamb of God', and Andrew calls him 'the Messiah'. The main theme of the readings, however, is that of CALL and RESPONSE. In the OT reading we have the call of Samuel, who played a big part in the building up of Israel. His call marked the beginning of a new era. It was through him that Israel got its first kings. This paves the way for the Gospel story of the call of the first disciples – Andrew, John and Peter. The call of Peter is highlighted because of the important role he played in the first community. In the two readings we see a unique and specific call, what is more commonly called a VOCATION. Each call needs a response. In the Church today we are very aware of the 'shortage' of response to the call to Priesthood and Religious Life. It would be unusual if the Lord were not continuing to issue such a call. As individuals, families and community we need not only to pray for Vocations but become ACTIVELY involved in promoting a response to God's call amongst us.

Temporary suspension of Mass with congregation in attendance

Following the News last week that cases of COVID-19 are increasing at an alarming rate, on a daily basis, in our area – up from just 57 cases per 100,000 of the population in mid-December to approx. 700 per 100,000 last week - We have taken the necessary steps to protect all members of our community. We are hearing of the difficulties which Hospital and ambulance Services are experiencing and the need to protect the NHS & Medical Staff.

On the advice of many parishioners, some of whom have continued to attend Mass in our Churches, we have decided **that both St. Patrick's and Our Lady of Lourdes Church will be CLOSED for regular PUBLIC MASSES**, <u>until further notice</u>. Masses will continue to be **LIVE-STREAMED** until it is deemed safe to have our congregations return. Times of Masses are found in the Newsletter, which can be found on the Parish Website, and Hard Copies can be collected from the Cabinet by the front door of Our Lady of Lourdes Church.

A further announcement will be made regarding opening of Our Lady of Lourdes Church for **PRIVATE PRAYER** when it is deemed safe to do so.
