PROSPECTUS FOR FIVE YEARS INTEGRATED B.A. LL.B. (HONS.) COURSE (CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM)

1. INTRODUCTION:

University Law College is a constituent college of the Utkal University, first started functioning from University campus from the academic session 1975-76, as an evening teaching department. The college achieved a glorious record in a very short span of time and became a most sought and preferable institution by the students desirous of pursuing legal education. Shifted in its own premises located at Vani Vihar Square on the side of N.H.-5 within the Utkal University campus in the year 1996. Now the college is running in morning and day shifts imparting 3 year LLB(Hons.) course, 5 year BALLB(Hons.) and LLM in (Human Rights) course respectively. The college is well connected with road and train services with major cities of State and the country.

The idea to introduce specialized five years integrated law course originated at the All India Law Minister's and Secretary's Conference held on 24th September, 1995 at Bhubaneswar. In response to the resolution of the said conference, the Utkal University started five year integrated BALLB(hons.) course in both the constituent colleges from the academic session, 1997-98. Since the 2014-15 academic session the Choice Based Credit System has been introduced in the 5 year integrated BALLB(Hons.) course. Now the University Law College is only constituent college of Utkal University after up gradation of M.S. Law College as M.S. Law University with effect from 1st June 2020 by Higher Education Department, Govt. of Odisha, vide letter no. HE-UNE-CoL-0001-2020/11494/HE dated 4th March 2020.

To monitor this specialized course, a High Power Committee has been constituted with a sitting Judge of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa as its Chairman alongwith the Vice-Chancellor of Utkal University, Chairman of State Bar Council, Representative of Bar Council of India, Teachers and others Officers of the Utkal University as its members. The curriculum is designed as per the guidelines prescribed by the Bar Council of India and the University Grants Commission, New Delhi.

2. OUR VISION:

The vision of the college is not only to produce students with legal draftsmanship and legal expertise and fit for bench and bar but also to inculcate amongst them a spirit for helping those who are in need of justice. Some broad objectives of the college are:

- a. To enculcate amongst the students the cultural, ethical and legal values in order to promote the rule of law in the society.
- b. To educate the students with basic principles of laws with critical evaluation thereof.
- c. To make the students aware with the new areas of law by organizing seminars, moot courts and symposia.

3. PROGRAMME OFFERED

Utkal University is imparting the five year integrated BALLB(Hons.) CBCS course at University Law College, Vani Vihar, Bhubaneswar. The course has been designed in the same line taking into account the

standards prescribed by the UGC and Bar Council of India, New Delhi. This course is at par with the syllabus prescribed by leading Universities/ Law Schools in India offering five year integrated BALLB(Hons.) programme in law.

4. STUDENTS STRENGTH:

University Law College, Vani Vihar, Bhubaneswar: 60 Seats

5. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

A candidate shall be eligible for admission into 5 year BALLB(Hons.), CBCS course, if he/she has passed +2 Examination (at least 10 +2 pattern) securing a minimum of 45% marks in aggregate for general category and 40% marks for SC/ST category.

6. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- 6.1. Application Forms may be obtained by depositing Rs. 500/- (Rupees five hundred only) by cash at the college counters. The same may be obtained on payment of Rs. 600/- (Rupees six hundred only) either by M.O./D.D drawn in favour of the Principal, University Law College, Bhubaneswar Payable at Bhubaneswar through Post or the Application Form may be down loaded from the college website and filled-in application form may be sent along with Rs.600/- (Rupees six hundred only) in the shape of D.D./ Banker's Cheque drawn in favour of the Principal, University Law College, Bhubaneswar Payable at Bhubaneswar.
- 6.2. The application form duly filled in by the candidate shall reach the office of the Principal before the last date mentioned in the advertisement/notification. The forms can be submitted either by person or by post. The institution shall not be held liable for any postal delay.

The following documents are to be attached along with the application form. No enclosures will be entertained after the submission of the application form.

- i) Self attested copy of HSC/SSC or equivalent certificate and marksheet
- ii) Self attested copy of CHSE/SSE certificate & marksheet
- iii) Self attested copy of conduct certificate from the institution last attended.
- iv) Self attested copy of the caste certificate in case of SC/ST category.
- v) Self attested copy of PH certificate in case of physically handicapped category.
- vi) Four passport size (2.5 x 3.5 cm) photographs signed by candidate.
- vii) One self addressed envelope size 12" x 5"
- viii) Original Bank Challan of the Application form

Note: Certificates issued by the following authorities would only be entertained.

- i) Caste certificate: Collector, Addl. District Magistrate, Sub-Collector, Gazetted Local Revenue Officer, DWO not below the rank of Deputy Collector, Tahasildar of the Area.
- ii) Handicap Certificate: CDMO of the District only with identity card issued by the appropriate authority.

7. SELECTION FOR ADMISSION

Selection for admission will be made on the basis of last qualifying examination (+2 Arts/ Science/ Commerce of Council of Higher Secondary Education, Odisha or its equivalent examination) marks only in order of merit. The list of equivalent board is given at **Annexure -1** of the Prospectus.

7.1 In case of candidates passing the Higher Secondary (+2) /equivalent examination compartmentally, average of marks secured in the subjects / concerned at both the examinations shall be taken into consideration to determine the aggregate.

7.2 Computation of marks in case of students passing from ICSE, CBSE and other Boards :

$$\text{Percentage calculation} = \frac{X * 100}{Y}$$

Where X = Total marks secured (There will be no selection of best 4 or best 5)

Y = Total full marks (if 4 subjects then Y= 400, if 5 subjects = 500 or Y may be 800/1000 as of other boards.

7.3 Intimation: intimation for admission will be sent to the selected candidates in order of merit from the merit list by speed post/ Regd. Post. The selected list will also be notified in the Notice Board and Website of the college.

8. RESERVATION

Scheduled Caste [SC] & Scheduled Tribe [ST]

- a) **SC-16.25%** of the sanctioned strength of each course shall be reserved for SC applicants. [G.O. 11710/HE, Dtd.: 01/06/2015]
- b) **ST-22.5%** of the sanctioned strength of each course shall be reserved for ST applicants. [G.O. 11710/HE, Dtd.:01/06/2015]
- c) The reserved seats are not interchangeable between SC & ST.
- d) SC/ST applicants selected for admission on their merit shall not be counted against reserved seats.
- e) However any modification made by the Government in the reservation policy will be followed during admission.
- f) Seats under reserved category will be de-reserved only if no students of that category are available for admission.

Persons with Disability (PWD) : 5% of sanctioned seats of all streams shall be reserved for PWD student with extent of disability not below 40% (Blind and Low Vision, Leprosy Cured, Dwarfism, Acid Attack Victims and Muscular Dystrophy, Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness) [G.O. 10161/HE, dated : 07/04/2018]

Ex-Serviceman [ESM[Serving Defense Personnel [SDP], children of Martyrs [CoM] : 1% of the sanctioned seats of all streams shall be reserved for Self/Children/Wife/Husband/ of Ex Serviceman, Serving Defence Personnel and Children of Martyrs. [G.O. 10161/HE, Dtd.: 07/04/2018]

9. COURSE FEE

Each candidates is required to pay a sum of Rs. 45,000(Rupees forty five thousand) only per annum towards course fee at the time of admission in shape of Bank Draft drawn in favour of the Principal University Law College, Vani Vihar, Bhubaneswar. However the course fee is subject to change in accordance of the decision of the High Power Committee/ University which will be intimated to the candidates sufficiently ahead of their re-admission.

10. COURSE STRUCTURE

BALLB(Hons.) Degree shall be awarded to candidates on successful completion of ten semesters. In ten semester, there shall be 60 papers with 6 papers in each semester carrying 100 marks. The course structure of the programme will have 360 credits in ten semesters as explained below:

N.B.: Besides core and elective credit courses, there shall be Summer Internship (4-6 weeks) for the students of 3rd Year and 4th Year as Audit Courses. The Audit Courses shall not be taken into account for calculation of credit.

11. DURATION OF SEMESTER

Each Semester shall not be less than 15 weeks duration with not less than 30 class hours per week including tutorials, moot room exercise and seminars provided there shall be at least 24 lecture hours per week.

12. ATTENDANCE

- a. As per the Common Minimum Standard (CMS) Guidelines 2013-2014 issued by the Government of Odisha communicated vide No. 21474 (H.E dtd. 21.08.2013) the duration of one period of general class shall be at least for 45 minutes.
- b. A candidate in order to qualify him /her self to appear the Semester Examination shall have to secure at least 75% of classroom attendance in each paper of that Semester.
- c. A candidate who represents the Institution in any International/National/State level Academic Sports Competition with prior permission of the Principal shall be awarded with 15% class room attendance during that Semester.
- d. A candidate, who has secured 60% to 74% of classroom attendance due to illness, may submit a Medical Certificate from a Regd. Medical Practitioner for adjustment of deficit attendance.
- e. The Principal shall enjoy the prerogative to award 10% of classroom attendance to a candidate.

13. SYSTEM OF EXAMINATION

Each course paper shall be of 100 marks. For evaluation, the overall structure of the distribution of marks in a theory based course shall be such that 20 Marks shall be allotted to Internal Assessments during the semester, while 80 Marks shall be allotted for the End Semester Examinations. For Theory and Activity Based Courses, the examination system shall be different as per details given below:

1. Theory Course

The scheme of examination for theory course shall include:

A. Internal Assessment

- i. The Internal Assessments in theory courses will comprise of written test and Viva-Voce, Such assignment shall carry 20 Marks, of which 10 Marks will be For Written Test and 10 Marks for Viva-Voce. There will be no internal assessment in paper -VI of both IXth and Xth Semester Examination.
- ii. The Written and Viva-Voce of the Internal Assessment shall be conducted by the teacher concerned, on a date fixed by the Principal. The concerned teacher shall submit the result of Internal Assessment to the Principal who shall forward the same to the Controller of Examinations, Utkal University.
- iii. Where a candidate fails to take examination in any one or more subject or having taken the examination has failed to secure the minimum pass marks in any one or more subjects or in the aggregate, his Internal Assessment marks shall be carried forward to the subsequent examination. The absentee or failed candidate shall have to clear all examinations within next two consecutive years. Besides a candidate securing less than 35 mark in a paper including Internal Assessment or less than 50% of the marks in aggregate in the end semester examination may reappear the said examination within the next two consecutive chances.

B. End Semester Examination and evaluation for 80 Marks

At the end of the each semester, there shall be a University Examination for 80 Marks. 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th and 9th Semesters will be held in the Month of December and 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th and 10th Semesters will be held before the Month of June. The Controller of Examinations, Utkal University shall notify the examination schedule on completion of courses.

3. The Credit System

The credits specified for 5 years B.A. LLB (Hons.) programme describe the weightages of various courses of the Programme. The number of credits along with grade points that the student has satisfactorily completed measures the performance of the student. Satisfactory progress of a student is subject to his/her maintaining a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA), as well as minimum grades in different courses of the programme. A certain number of credits must be earned by the student of qualify for the degree. Description of credit distribution for Core Courses Activity Based Courses and Elective Courses has already been shown.

(A) Assignment of Credits :

Credits of a course shall be assigned in the following manner :

- (a) For all theory (lecture) courses, one credit shall be assigned for one- hour lecture per
- (b) Credits shall be in whole numbers

- (B) The performance of a candidate in a semester or upto a semester shall be measured by SGPA and CGPA, details of which are given below :

SGPA : Semester Grade Point Average.

CGPA : Cumulative Grade Point Average.

Calculation of Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and
Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) :

C_i = Number of credits, assigned for the i^{th} course of a semester for which SGPA is to be calculated.

P_i - Grade point earned in the i^{th} course.

Where

C_j = Number of credits assigned for the j^{th} course, upto the semester for which CGPA is to be calculated.

P_j = Grade point earned in j^{th} course.

$j=1 \text{ ---- } m$, represent the number of courses in which a student was registered up to the semester for which CGPA is to be calculated.

4. Scripts and Duration of Examinations.

- (i) Except when otherwise directed by the Regulation or by the examiner in the examination paper, every candidates shall answer questions in English Language in the examination in all the courses.
- (ii) Each individual paper shall be of 3 (three) hours duration.

Explanation:

Letter grades O, E, A, B & C in a course mean that candidate has passed that course.

If a candidate secures minimum of 35 marks in individual paper (s) (Theory+Internal) but obtains 50% or above marks in aggregate in the end semester examination, such candidate will be awarded Grade according to the percentage. The candidates must secure at least 28 marks out of 80 marks in theory paper.

The F grade denotes poor performance, i.e., failing in the course. A student has to appear at subsequent examination (s), (next two consecutive chances only) as provided in the regulation in all courses in which he/she obtains "F" grade, until a passing Grade is obtained.

The I Grade is awarded, when a student does not appear in the examination of course/courses. This shall be treated as "F" Grade.

6. Grace Rules : Grace mark shall be awarded as per the following Guidelines :

- 1% of the total marks in aggregate can be awarded to a candidate for enabling him/her to pass in a semester examination provided he/she secures minimum 35 marks in individual paper (s).
- The candidate(s) securing I Grade will not be eligible for grace mark.
- Grace Mark will not be awarded for making up shortfall in minimum pass mark in individual paper or to obtain division or in CGPA.

14. DEGREE REQUIREMENTS :

A candidate will be eligible for award of B.A.LL.B (Hons.) degree if he/she satisfied the following:

1. Has secured CGPA 6.0 or more.
2. Has cleared the credit requirements with pass grade or more in each subject.
3. Has at least a satisfactory conduct.
4. Has cleared all the theory, activity based and elective courses of all semesters.
5. Credit requirements for the Degree shall be 360.
6. The passed candidates may be awarded with the division according to the following criteria :

1) First Division with Distinction	CGPA 8.5 and above
2) First Division	CGPA 6.5 and above, but below 8.5
3) Second Division	CGPA 6.0 and above, but below 6.5

Note: The SGPA and CGPA shall be computed upto 2 places of decimals (truncated at the second place).
The Conversion formula for converting CGPA to the corresponding Percentage of Marks will be as follows :

$$X = 10Y - 0.5$$

Where, X = Percentage of Marks
Y = CGPA

15. RANKING TO THE CANDIDATE :

1. Ranking shall be given to only those candidates who pass all the courses of the programme in one attempt.
2. The marks obtained by him/her at the examination shall be considered as the basis for the University Ranking, Scholarships and other distinctions.
3. In order to get the benefit of this provision the student should claim that he /she is eligible for this benefit and get a decision in writing after proving his/her eligibility there for.

16. GRADE SHEET :

At the end of each even semester, grade sheet shall be made available to each student free of cost. However, if a student requires a duplicate grade sheet he/she should apply to the Controller of Examinations, Utkal University, Vani Vihar, Bhubaneswar in the prescribed format along with the requisite fee.

17. ACHIEVEMENTS BY OUR STUDENTS:

Every year students from our institutions join the judicial service conducted by various Public Service commissions, Banking and financial Institution besides legal profession thereby making both the college proud.

18. CAMPUS DISCIPLINE :

18.1 - A student of this College must behave and conduct himself/herself in a disciplined manner both inside and outside the College premises. He/She must abide by all the rules and regulations prescribed from time to time by the College Authorities and shall not conduct himself/herself in any manner prejudicial to the honour and dignity of the Institution.

18.2- the campus of the College is strictly a no-smoking and non-alcoholic zone. Any deviation from this will be seriously viewed which shall attract strong action from the authorities. Ragging and Sexual Harrassment are also strictly prohibited. Strong disciplinary proceeding shall be initiated against the student violating these, which may result in severe punishment including suspension and expulsion from the Institution.

18.3- The decision of the Principal with regard to the matters not covered in this Prospectus or with regard to any dispute arising out of the interpretation of any clause / clauses of the Prospectus, shall be final and binding.
