He crawled out of bed and he got down on his knees


He closed his little eyes, folded his little hands And spoke to God like he was talking to a friend And I said son now where'd you learn to pray like that



Discussion of current/ongoing projects:

**Collection for Ingathering**- Eau Claire Lake Street UMC will be our drop off site. Collection there will be Monday, 6/14 to Monday, 6/21. Items at their site will be picked up on 6/23 by truck to take to the distribution site. Cheri will plan to take all items from Holcombe UMC to Eau Claire on Monday, 6/14. All items from our congregation need to be at the church no later than Sunday, 6/13!
