

Stained Glass Windows

Tom Kaufmann and John Diekmann met with Pittsburgh Stained Glass Co. The owner, Kirk Weaver inspected all the windows in the building. This company made and installed all the original windows in the building in 1917. Kirk is the third generation to own the business. The altar window was made by them and installed in 1950. They have the original invoices for the work and they contacted us to come and inspect the windows.

We do have a small hole in the large window next to the driveway. He said to repair that hole, the center panel would have to be removed and that would be estimated to run about \$5,000 to \$6,000. He recommended doing nothing with it at this point. It is covered by a storm window. Somewhere in the future, the window will need restoration because over time the lead does begin to move and buckle. This may not need attention for another 20 or 30 years. The same thing applies to the Resurrection Window in the balcony. Upon examination, you can see some places it have buckled, but won't need restoration for another 20 or 30 years. He had the original invoice for that window and that cost was \$270 in 1917. To replace that window today would be over \$100,000.

Our windows are called American Opalescent Style. It is not correct to call them Tiffany Style. They are a treasure to our church and this congregation.

Kitchen and Restroom Floors

Council has voted to replace the floor covering in the kitchen and women's restroom. Smitty's Floors has been chosen to do the work. The flooring will be waterproof and will resemble a light colored hardwood look. This project will be funded from our investments with the Biard Company. (This is the company that bought out our Hilliard-Lyons account.) This work will begin sometime after Easter. The cost for the floors will be about \$4500 but there will be additional cost to remove the toilets and reinstall them after the flooring installation.
