### From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Folks.

On May 17 I will be installed by the United Church of Christ as your settled pastor. Installation is an opportunity for churches within the Hampden Association to witness to and become a part of the covenant we made with each other over a year ago. It is a celebration of the commitments we have made to minister together, and an opportunity to share that joy with the wider church. Still struggling with the concept of "Christian Stewardship"? That's okay - the foundation of Stewardship is both simple (all that we are, and have, are gifts from God) and complex (all that we are, and have, are gifts from God).

#### Simple:

**Life** is God's gift. So is **time**, the form in which life passes from cradle to grave. So are our **talents**, the gifts God has given to each of us to shape a life.

#### Complex:

- \*How shall we use **life** and **time** through the hours that we have them?
- \*What will we do with the **talents** given to each of us by God?
- \*Why has He given each of us just that unique combination of skills and potential which makes every human being different from every other?
- \*How should we use the goods our efforts acquire?
- \*Is all that we have been given, and earned, ours to use as we please?

<u>\*If not:</u> how much of our **lives**, our **time**, and the fruit of our **talents** should we offer to the Lord's service, and to our neighbors?

These are some of the questions we consider as we attempt to journey together toward a deeper understanding of our purpose as followers of Christ.

Again, the journey is:

<u>Simple:</u> understanding that Stewardship is what the Christian life is all about.

<u>Complex:</u> opening ourselves to the spiritual transformation which makes that understanding possible.

In <u>Romans 12: 1-2, Paul describes</u> how we can BEGIN this transformation:

- " So here's what I want you to do, God helping you:
- Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walkingaround life—and place it before God as an offering.
- Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him.
- Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking.
- Instead, <u>fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out.</u>
- Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you."

#### The Message (MSG)

Transforming our thoughts and habits will take time and a conscious commitment to change, for each of us. The good news is, being Christians, we believe in supporting one another in seeking God's help, so that \* "...as we journey with Him, using His gifts according to His intentions, He changes us and the world around us to more perfectly reflect His grace, justice, and truth."

We pray that you are as excited as we are at what God's plans for FCC's journey to, and through, transformation may look like in the coming months!

#### Clean Up Day

In anticipation of warmer weather, Todd's Installation, and our Family Picnic, the Property Committee invites you to a Clean Up Day on May 9 from 9-2. Bring rakes, gloves, and a hearty spirit ready to take on the remnants of Winter and welcome Spring to our FCC properties.

The Lions Club will have a special offering to all, a free eye, hearing and blood pressure screening clinic. Eye examinations and hearing tests will be available all day at the Eyemobile Trailer in the parking lot during our Craft Fair. Eyes will be examined for glaucoma and visual acuity, similar to the Registry of Motor Vehicles testing procedure and forwarded for medical review if a problem is detected. In addition to eye and hearing testing, blood pressure screening will also be available. Results are compared to "normal" and follow-up suggestions will be offered if need be. Anyone over sixteen may take advantage of the screenings, and children under sixteen may be tested with parental approval.
