

How to set up telephone worship

Graham Martin from St James URC/ Methodist chur-ch in Woolton, Liverpool, of-fers advice about setting up church services via the tele-

SINCE early July St James URC/Methodist church has URC/Methodist church has been holding weekly services on the telephone. These are live, and normally with four people taking the service: reader, prayer, preacher and host. Weekly congregations are around 20 and slowly rising. Perhaps 35 people will attend at least one serv-ice a month. The service was initially

The service was initially The service was initially introduced to include mem-bers of St James' congrega-tion/church community who were not on the internet and so unable to access YouTube services or Zoom. Of 28 "di-gitally limited" members of our church community more than 20 attend regularly. **Technical brief** Various companies provide

to manage the call, for ex-ample to switch the micro-phones of all other participriores of all other partici-pants off (or back on), to list all the speakers who have dialled in, to allow partici-pants to mute (or unmute) just their own phone.

ctice rather more peo practice rather more people now join in than said the were interested – the cal just "publicised" what wa going to happen. We then hand deliver (so metimes post) an invitatio metimes post) an invitation to worship for each Sunday (delivered along with our normal church newsletter). Our telephone worship se-rvices last 15-20 minutes and we ask the preachers to preach for five-six minutes. This timing seems to work well

well. The host welcomes people as they join, hushes up the conversation at the start of the service, gives the name of everyone who has joined (including the chance for anyone who has been missed to say "Hello"), then says the people arguere and acts as opening prayers and acts as "continuity announcer" for the rest of the service, fin ishing off with leading on the grace and benediction/dis-missal. There is a chance for more chat after the service. Hopefully this is all you need to set up your own serA fascinating article in the Methodist Recorder about setting up telephone worship.


We are extremely fortunate for all the hard work by Graham Martin.



St. Valentine.



The day gets its name from a famous saint, but there are several stories of who he was.

The popular belief about St Valentine is that he was a priest and physician from Rome in the third century AD. who suffered martyrdom during the persecution of Christians by Emperor Claudius II.

Claudius had banned marriage because he thought married men were bad soldiers.

Valentine felt this was unfair, so he broke the rules and arranged marriages in secret.

When Claudius found out, Valentine was thrown in jail and sentenced to death.

When he was taken to be killed on 14th February, Valentine signed a letter "from your Valentine" to his jailer's daughter, whom he had befriended and healed from blindness.

Letter LXXII. p. 210. and since Gate me Green eb. 1496.9. 16 8.30

This is the oldest known Valentine's Day message in English. It was written in 1477.

Gospel Reading: Mark chapter 9 verses 2 to 9

² After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them. ³ His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them. ⁴ And there appeared before them Elijah and Moses, who were talking with Jesus.

⁵ Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." ⁶ (He did not know what to say, they were so frightened.) ⁷ Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!"

⁸ Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus.⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until the Son of Man had risen from the dead.



Property and Special Projects committee update.

We thought that a short report to you all on the daily 'happenings' in our buildings would keep you updated on life which still continues here at St. James.

Although we are once again plunged into a lockdown and our church building is closed maintenance and emergency works still continue. A number of you will remember with a shiver that our church boiler ceased to work for our last two morning services. It seems that these essential machines always do fail at the most inconvenient times! It just being prior to the Christmas break parts were not immediately available and engineers were either finished for the holiday break or in isolation mode because of Covid 19. However, we now have a repaired boiler – a number of new parts were required – at a cost of £850 but at least the building is now warm and ready to welcome you back.

Two small windows in an office in the hall were found to be in a state of bad repair following an ingress of water and have had to be replaced. During installation of these two windows and essential gutter cleaning and replacement of a high hopper to the side of the hall further rotting frames were found to the staircase window and large window to the small hall. Fortunately, our wonderful maintenance go to man was able to repair these and has worked through all this appalling weather to make them watertight and hopefully in good repair for some years yet.

There has been a number of damp areas appear in the main hall which have needed immediate attention for safety reasons. We have a water leak from the tower on the roof. This week end it was found that the two flat roofs to the new sports hall storage extension are leaking badly, in one place causing the fire alarm to activate due to water ingress into the unit and will need urgent attention. So, you see that there is never a dull (or wet) moment!

There is a constant need to maintain securely and safely both our wonderful buildings but this maintenance comes at a cost and as we have virtually no rental income from the hall due to groups being unable to meet this is a worrying time.

Which leads me to our **Special Projects Group** which plans to meet, via Zoom, on Thursday 25th February at 7.45 p.m. if anyone would like to attend that meeting, it is an open one, please contact me beforehand. <u>wdoig45@gmail.com</u> or 07867795179) OR if anyone has ANY ideas whatsoever as to how we can do some very much needed but fun fund raising during these very restricted times please do contact me.
