

PREZAN MILITARY ACADEMY TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR ENTRY

The Prezan Military Academy is pleased to extend entry to foreign diplomats and their military personnel, regarding military education. Regarding admittance, this is a privilege for foreign governments and registration is voluntary on their behalf. With this being the case, terms and conditions are accepted upon entry to this institution.

Entry Terms and Conditions

- All students in this institution are considered *cadets* upon beginning their education within this academy. At no point will faculty or fellow cadets refer to others as their micronational title or rank, to level the playing field as a class.
- 2. Physical and virtual class attendance is crucial for a cadet to successfully understand the curriculum taught. Out of the six blocks of instruction, cadets are required to attend five out of the six blocks. A cadet may be expelled from this academy for failure to adhere to this attendance requirement, or if the cadet is unable to make up missed time.
- 3. Cadets are required to be prompt for class, meaning arriving no less than five minutes before the start of each session. Cadets who arrive late without notice to an instructor or class leader may be disciplined for such actions.
- 4. While this overall academy may be tuition free, the creation of diplomas and transcripts per student are not. Cadets must be willing to pay either \$4 USD for physical copies or \$2 for digital copies.
- 5. Cadets shall understand that academy instructors are volunteers, not paid, and spend much of their time at work and in their free time creating curriculum and teaching classes. With this being the case, cadets should steer clear of resigning from the academy, to avoid wasted time. Resignation letters must be sent at least one day prior to a scheduled class. Failure to adhere to this rule may cause a dishonorable resignation.

All cadets automatically agree to these entry terms and conditions upon being accepted into the Prezan Military Academy. There are no exceptions or special treatment issued to any cadet, regardless of their claimed royalty, title, position, or authority of their micronation.
