RIVERVIEW CEMETERY REMAINS AN ACTIVE BURIAL **GROUND** with 22 burials in 2020. Friends of Historic Riverview Cemetery a 501c/3 non-profit organization assumed ownership of the cemetery in January 2009. We have assisted families and funeral directors with 321 burials and placement of approximately 130 grave markers. We have also replied to hundreds of phone calls, emails, and letters each year seeking information for pre-planning, historical, genealogical, visiting purposes.

The 42 acres of Greenspace is of tremendous value in Wilmington. It is surrounded by homes, churches, and businesses with regular pedestrian and vehicular traffic along

Market and Washington Streets.

Wind and rain storms took 7 huge trees to the ground and 13 other trees sustained major damage. FHRC board members and Probation & Parole community service volunteers assisted with the clean-up. The Davey Tree Company did the 'heavy lifting' professional work. We are grateful to those who donated funds for this unexpected expense that exceeded our Annual Budget.
