Charity and Stewardship Appeal – CSA will be this weekend and next. This year's theme is *Go to Joseph*. On this 150th anniversary of Pope Blessed Pius IX naming him the Universal Patron of the Catholic Church, Pope Francis has commemorated this great spiritual gift to the Church by naming 2020-2021 the Year of St. Joseph. Thank you, in advance, for your generosity to this collection. Since we support two Catholic schools, after the first 20% of our goal, the rest comes back to our parishes, so it is a great benefit to us. That first 20% is also very important. Those beneficiaries do great work on our behalf for the both the people of God and our neighbors to show them the love of Christ. We'll have materials at church first, but can mail to those who may not yet be back to mass. Our CSA goals are: \$10,700 for St. John's and \$6,600 at St. Vitus'. The average pledge has been around \$200. Whatever you can give is great. We usually have about 70 that pledge at St. John's and 50 that pledge at St. Vitus'. The bulletin attachment shows the beneficiaries and how much goes to each.

St. Joseph the Worker – Next Saturday is the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. This Feast reminds us of the value of work. In 1955 Pope Pius XII established the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker on May 1st as a counter-celebration to the communists' May Day. The Soviet Union made May 1st Workers Day, but their emphasis was that workers are "cogs" in the great wheel of work for the State, and it was atheistic, without God. St. Joseph the Worker puts a different emphasis on work. The dignity of each worker comes before the dignity of work. Each person is made in the image of God. St. Joseph placed his work in the context of Loving God above all things and his neighbor as himself. So, indeed, work has a dignity, but humans are more dignified than work. You might pray some prayer to St. Joseph leading up to the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Here are two examples. **Short Prayer to St. Joseph the Worker**: St. Joseph be with us in our work. Bless the work that God has given each of us to do. May we work for God's glory and the service and neighbor. Amen. **Prayer to St. Joseph**: Hail Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.


