The Plant Sale hurdles were fielded by all, considering we had to do the logistics of the event from my backyard! Spring Valley's closures made the Plant Sale a challenging event!

Another challenge that we are facing is our Nature Club meetings and programs. The guidelines outlined by the CDC make the prospect of having our monthly meetings virtually impossible. To maintain the advised guidelines and to ensure the health and safety of our members, friends, and members of the community, we have determined that the monthly Nature Club meetings will be suspended for the balance of 2020.

Spring Valley Update for July/August Newsleaf – 2020

Here are the latest updates on operations at Spring Valley as we enter Phase 4 of the state of Illinois COVID-19 response and reopening. The situation does continue to change, sometimes quickly, so for more up-to-date information, please visit the Schaumburg Park District website at www.parkfun.com. You may also call the Nature Center at (847) 985-2100; however, staff is not always there to answer the phones and it may take a day or two before we reply to messages left on voicemail.

- Spring Valley's grounds and walking trails remain open for walkers every day from 8am-8pm. Portable toilets are available near the Nature Center and Merkle Cabin; however, no restrooms are open for use and no drinking water is available.
- Spring Valley's facilities remain closed. This includes the Nature Center and Heritage Farm.
- Bison's Bluff Nature Playground is scheduled to reopen on July 10 for limited capacity use every day from 10am-8pm. Special restrictions and fees apply, so see more on this below.
- All scheduled special events and walk-in programs through the end of August have been cancelled.
- Most scheduled summer camps and other programs have been cancelled. Some of our summer programs ARE
 being held (see below), but with modifications to limit the group size and conduct nearly all activities outdoors.
 Our fall programs will be redesigned to comply with group maximums and social distancing guidelines, in
 accordance with Illinois Phase 4 guidelines.
- With restrictions on group gatherings, all scheduled meetings are also cancelled until further notice.
- As mentioned in May, the Heritage Farm's programming has been paused for the year. All livestock have been
 moved offsite. Cattle are being cared for at a farm near Marengo, IL and our draft horses were loaned to an
 Indiana Amish farm for the season.
- With most facilities closed and programming reduced, many of Spring Valley's staff are still furloughed. Some
 volunteers are being welcomed back to assist with care of gardens at Heritage Farm and behind the Nature
 Center. Other volunteers are helping with invasive weed control, trail maintenance, bluebird monitoring, and
 keeping the grounds clean. With few staff back to active duty, this volunteer help is most welcome.

In determining what can be safely reopened, the Schaumburg Park District is following the State of Illinois guidelines and additional recommendations from the Center for Disease Control (CDC). Decisions are also based on finances. Since the Schaumburg Park District relies heavily on program and user fees to fund its operations – 50% of all operations are funded by user fees, with resident taxes making up the rest – the district is taking a heavy hit financially due to the lengthy shut-down and reduced volunteer programming. For that reason, facilities that are unlikely to pay for themselves via program entrance fees are being kept closed for now.

Be safe and well, everyone, and take advantage of Spring Valley's beauty whenever you can!

Bison's Bluff Interim Operations Plan

July 10-August 30. (Slightly modified operations may be proposed for September and October).

- Hours of Operation: Daily, 10:00am-8:00pm
- Play sessions begin at 10:00am, 11:30am, 1:00pm, 2:30pm, 4:00pm, 5:30pm, and 7:00pm
- On-line reservations through ActiveNet required, accessed via www.parkfun.com
- Cost for one-hour play session will be \$2/person
- No more than 50 patrons may be inside the play area (includes adults)
- Play area is closed for cleaning and sanitation for a half-hour between each play session.
- Main play area entrance is staffed during operating hours
- No Group Use permitted
- Water feature will NOT be operational for safety/health reasons
- No Picnics permitted inside play area
- Play area will be <u>closed during rainy or inclement weather</u>; cancelled play sessions due to inclement weather can be rescheduled or refunded.

July/August Programs

NOTE: On-line pre-registration is required for each of the programs listed below. All classes have limited capacity and will be held outdoors.

Firefly Fandango - July 10, 11, & 12, 8:45-9:45pm

Witness one of nature's marvels as the summer sun sets on Spring Valley's prairies and woods. After a short discussion on fireflies and how and why they produce light, groups will be taken on a twilight wagon ride to view the incredible light show to be seen on mid-summer evenings. Fee is \$5/person; All ages

Insect Safari - July 8 & August 5, 3-5pm

The summer prairie is buzzing with excitement and insects! Youngsters will go on a hike to catch and study the large variety of insects to be seen at Spring Valley. Participants will be supplied with capture nets and bug boxes, play games, work on a craft project, and have a ton of six-legged fun. Fee is \$12/person; Ages 5-8

Just Desserts - July 11, 1-4pm

Wild berries abound at Spring Valley, and many are edible! Youngsters will go on a hike to learn where black raspberries and blackberries grow and will harvest some to make a Dutch oven cobbler over a campfire. Participants should wear long pants and closed-toe shoes for this activity.

Fee \$16/person; Ages 7-12

Morning Meditation Meander – July 18 & August 22, 8-9pm

Enjoy a guided meditative walk celebrating the changing seasons. Meet in front of the nature center, and feel free to bring your own insulated mug of tea to enjoy after the walk.

Fee is \$12/person; Adults 18+

Creek Explorers – July 18 & August 15, 3-5pm

Prepared to get your feet wet as a naturalist takes youngsters on an adventure to see what lives in Spring Valley's creeks. Participants should meet at the Nature Center and wear soft-soled shoes that can get wet. Fee is \$15/person; Ages 8-12

Nature Playdates – July 9, July 30, August 20, 10-11am

This class is designed to help you and your young child connect with nature. Our child play experts will guide you through a series of unstructured play activities, using the natural habitats at Spring Valley. Children will be encouraged to create, build, and use their imaginations. Dress for an outdoor adventure! Fee is \$10/parent-child; For parents with 1-2 children ages 1-4

Kid's Garden Party – August 15 & September 12, 10am-12pm

Give your child the gift of a love of gardening! Kids will get dirty while lending a hand in Spring Valley's Kid's Garden and playing games that celebrate the harvest. Every participant will go home with a sampling of fresh vegetables. Fee is \$12/person; Ages 6-9

Spring Valley began as a dream by one of the founders of the Village of Schaumburg, Ellsworth Meineke. Early on he referred to it as "The Spring Valley Dream." It was he who convinced the Schaumburg Park District and the Village of Schaumburg to work together to acquire and preserve land for Spring Valley.
