School Traffic

I have been approached by many concerned people, both parents and residents, as to the staggering display of chaos at school times in and around the roundabout of Mornington Tyabb Road and Boes/Jones Roads which is causing insufficient parking at the primary school.

One amazing piece of driving was seen last week when two vehicles decided that the quickest way to get through the traffic blocking the intersection was to go **the wrong way around the roundabout** at what seemed to be considerable speed and then turn up Boes Road. How incredibly stupid can you be?

We first raised the subject of the traffic on this intersection many years ago through the State government and Shire which resulted in it being thrown back to the school to pay for any possible rectification and better parking arrangements and obviously this has proven to be well beyond their capacity. So where do we go?

We have additionally made representation many times to the Shire to assist in investigations to come up with a plan to solve the chaos before someone is seriously injured or worse dies, but to no positive resolve. One other complication is that Mornington Tyabb Road is a VicRoads controlled road and Boes/Jones Road is a Shire road.

I fully appreciate that because of its location any normal parking plan is not easy, however I believe that the simplest may be the easiest and most logical and that is to acquire a portion of Olivers Creek Reserve directly west of the current playground/oval at the school. I expect that there will be some people who won't like this idea, however they need to accept that losing a little of the Reserve for the safety of the children and parents far outweighs the loss of a small part of the Reserve and is far better than someone being seriously injured due to political bureaucracy or social media hype.

So, as we know from history and our aborted attempts in getting this issue resolved, it requires a concerted effort from everyone, like a 'flash mobbing' approach in contacting the numerous authorities such as the school, the Shire, the local State government minister and the education department.

Help With Your Christmas Cooking

When your Christmas cooking and preparation is becoming too much and the hungry hordes are rapidly approaching here's something you can try.

Classic Christmas Cake



Ingredients:

internet and a lateral a

- I cup butter
- l cup sugar
- 6 drops lemon juice
- Some nuts
- 4 large eggs
- ltspn baking powder
- 4 cups dried mixed fruits
- I or 2 bottles of whisky

4 lar Itsp 4 cu I or *Method:* Sam bow ensu and 2 cu in th sam sift 3 Vha I tal and over thing

Sample whisky to check quality. Select a large mixing bowl. Check the whisky again as it must be just right. To ensure that the whisky is of top quality, pour I large glass and drink fast. Meanwhile, check the whisky is still top quality by crying another tup. Repeat. Add 2 large eggs, 2 cups dried fruit and beat till high. If the fruit gets stuck in the beaters, push it through with a drewscriber ... sample the whisky again, checking the consistency. Next, sift 3 cups salt, or something, it really doesn't matter. Whample the whisky. Sift half a pint of lemon juice. Fold I tablespoon brown sugar, or whatever colour you find and mix well. Drink the remaining whisky. Grease the oven and turn cake into pan at 200 degrees. Pour everything into the oven and go to bed.

Fire Restrictions



The Fire Danger Period is when CFA restricts the use of fire in the community. This is to help prevent fires from starting. CFA declares the Fire Danger Period for each Shire or Council at different times in the lead up to the fire season. It depends on the amount of rain, grassland curing rate and other local conditions.

To be certain that you are able to burn off check with Council, not forgetting that different rules apply to different sized properties.

The Fire Danger Period for Tyabb is between December and May

This year's lolly run and present run will be done on the same day on Sunday 19th December commencing 9am.
