Preschool: We had a great, short week! We have been working on beginning our letters at the top and going from left to right. This week we will begin learning our letters and sounds. We will begin with "A". We will talk about all kinds of things that begin with the "a" sound. We plan to paint this week and learn about apples! We have really been practicing some patriotic songs and learning the Pledge of Allegiance. Ask your child about this at home! Have a great, first full school week of September! -Miss Stacie

Kind: Here comes week 4! This week we will be taking home flashcards to practice nightly. The flashcards will change as your student starts to master them. We will continue working on identifying vertical and horizontal lines in letters, numbers, and in our environments. Please read with your child each night, and point out the rhyming words in your stories. If you are finding that your books do not have rhyming words, please let me know and I can send some home!

1st/2nd: This week we will continue our focus on sight words and phonics. We will have DIBELS testing this week with Mr. Weldon. Second grade will have spelling words every week and it is extremely important for you to be studying those at home every night. It shows in the daily work, as well as the tests, if you are working on those at home. Second grade will have a science test on Friday. Study guides will go home Wednesday. First grade begins a new science unit today and will be working on it for the next couple weeks. Remember, everyone needs to be reading their books so they

can take and pass AR tests online. Everyone is required to pass 5 before October 7. Have a great week! -Mrs. Hird

3rd/4th: This week is going to be a busy week for our class. Science study guides went home over the weekend for review. We reviewed again today and both grades have their Science test tomorrow. Fourth grade will have a math test on Tuesday. On Wednesday, both classes will have a test in Social Studies over week 2 in their Missouri Studies Weekly. Of course on Friday, we will have our normal spelling tests. Our class will also have DIBELS testing with Mr. Weldon on Wednesday. The kids are doing great and starting to settle into our routine. 5th/6th: 5th and 6th graders are given a "Word of the Day" and then a quiz over the words for the week on Fridays. Please make sure to study these words throughout the week! In Science, 5th grade will be reading about seed plants and will be getting ready to test next week over Ch. 1. 6th graders will be looking at geologic time and earthquakes. In English, both grades will look at conjunctions and run-on sentences and in Reading we will continue with main idea and supporting details. In Social Studies, 5th grade will be reading about Vikings and 6th grade will be getting ready to test next week over Ch. 1. **Don't forget-AR book requirements are due Oct. 15th.**

7th/8th Comm. Arts: Students will begin writing Patriot's Pen essays this week! -Mrs. Foster

5th/6th Math: In fifth grade, students are looking at story problems involving missing addends and looking at missing numbers in subtraction. In sixth grade, students will be looking at story problems involving both missing minuends and subtrahends and equal groups.

7th/8th: Well, the honeymoon period is over, but that's not a bad thing. In science, 7th grade has begun a new unit on properties and interactions of matter. Eighth grade students will continue their unit on principles of electricity and magnetism. In grammar, both groups are working on finishing up a unit on the nature of sentences and will be moving on to specific parts of speech very soon. **Tests This Week: 7th Science: Wednesday, Algebra: Thursday** -Mr. Ewing
