Why It Matters

- Boost your mood nice welcome for visitors
- More Space for Planting
- Decorating Outside as valuable as Decorating Indoors
- Increases home's value and shortens time to sell

Quick and Affordable Fixes

Start with the front door

Paint to create accent and mark entryway Add a seasonal wreath or other decoration Containers

> Scale appropriate to the house Color and textures work together

District Delicer and textures work together

Edge your Planting Beds as needed and desired

Shovel for small beds – edger for larger spaces

Freshen mulch

Should be functional and aesthetically pleasing

Leaves, woodchips and stone

Provide backdrop for gardens and not overwhelm design

2 to 3" layer is sufficient – don't overdo

Lightly till mulch to loosen and freshen the look

The Next Step

Add a Front Entrance Garden

Complements your home's architecture

In scale with your home

Directs visitors to the front door

Seasonal Interest

Reflects your personality

Lawn Care

May choose to eliminate – more on that later

Traditional Lawn

Fertilize at least once a year to greatly reduce weeds

Memorial Day, Labor Day and Halloween for denser lawn

Mow high and often

Growing Grass in heavy shade

Shade tolerant

Pennsylvania sedge

Shade tolerant groundcovers

Don't kill the trees for the flowers

Managing Overgrown Shrubs

Prune

Late winter for summer bloomers

Right after flowering for spring blooming shrubs

Renewal – remove a few older stems to ground and reduce height by 1/3

Rejuvenation – cut the whole plant back to the ground – regrowth may be taller

Replace

Right size plant for the location

Hardy and pest resistant

Added value

Multiple seasons of interest

Fragrance

Bird and butterfly appeal

Properly space for long term benefits

Fill space between with annuals and perennials

Divide Overgrown Perennials

Spring bloomers in fall, fall bloomers in spring, summer bloomers spring or fall OR when you have the time

Go All Out

Maximize your enjoyment and your front yard's beauty

Adding Trees, Shrubs and more planting beds

Consider your home's architecture

Scale and color

Plants should anchor not overpower house

Keep windows, drive and walkways clear

Design with maintenance in mind

A beautiful landscape is only as pretty as it is well maintained

Turn them into gardens

No Mow – Meadow

Create a Front Entrance City Area
