This binder is a continuation of Dr. Anderson's 2005 book, Riverview Cemetery: Reading the Stones – A collection of Memories from the First State. Her book was made possible by 220 contributors around the country who 'remembered' approximately 1000 deceased loved ones. There are 36,500 people at Riverview Cemetery with space for 20,000 more burials. Books are available for purchase (\$20).
