

Last year during Lent I encouraged everyone to join me in the spiritual practice of Lectio Divina. This involves listening for God's word through reading the Scriptures. Here are the five steps of Lectio Divina:

- · Reading. Read a passage slowly and carefully within the bible.
- · Prayer. Having a loving conversation with God.
- · Meditation. Thinking deeply or dwelling upon a spiritual reality within a text.
- · Contemplation. Resting in God's presence.
- · Action. Go and do likewise.

I would love to see all of us participate in this practice and then share with others what God is speaking to you through this spiritual discipline. Pick a book in the Bible that you would like to go through and then read one chapter each week. Read that chapter through at least twice during the week and keep a journal handy to write down any reflections or things that God brings to the surface through the text. Ask how God is at work in this text and what am I called to do in response to reading it. I will be reading through the book of Romans and you can choose to join me in this reading or pick another book. I am excited to see what God is going to do in our spiritual growth and discipleship through this practice.

Want to talk more about it? I will be practicing presence and available for discussions on Wednesday mornings (10-noon) at Swallow Coffee House in Lake Mills and on Thursday evenings (7-8:30) at Worth Brewing Company in Northwood. Or we can schedule a different time to meet. May this Lenten journey be a fruitful time of spiritual growth and personal reflection.


