This regular meeting of the Connellsville City Council was held this evening at 7:00 p.m. in City Council Chambers, Municipal Building, at 110 North Arch Street, Connellsville, PA. REGULAR AGENDA:

Resolution No. 5-1-2013: "To approve the minutes from the April 17, 2013 City Council Meeting."

A vote upon the adoption of the resolution resulted as follows: Affirmative were Karpiak, Geyer, Ritch, Weaver and Mayor Matthews. The majority of the votes being affirmative, the resolution was adopted.

Resolution No. 5-2-2013: "To waive the 4-day Resolution Rule to allow for items submitted after the 4-day rule to be read at the meeting tonight, such Resolutions will be marked with an asterisk."

MAYOR MATTHEWS:

Police Department Report

Matthews stated he and Councilman Ritch were at the Community Center for the Molinaro Band and gave Mr. Molinaro a Proclamation right at that sight.

Mayor Matthews and Councilman Ritch also went to Bethlehem Church to present them with a Proclamation of being there for 70 years.

Proclamation, May 2013 as National Bike Month and Bicycle Safety Month and Saturday, June 1, 2013 as the final celebration by promoting the "Bike for Book's event at Yough River Park

Councilman Ritch then noted that the Mayor and City Council attended the Carnegie Library's 110th Birthday on Sunday, May 5, 2013 and presented a Proclamation.

Proclamation, May 15, 2013 as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which it falls as Police Week

Resolution No. 5-3-2013: "To accept the resignation of David Waggett from the Zoning Hearing Board effective immediately."

A vote upon the adoption of the resolution resulted as follows: Affirmative were Karpiak, Geyer, Ritch, Weaver and Mayor Matthews. The majority of the votes being affirmative, the resolution was adopted.

Resolution No. 5-4-2013: "To appoint Carl Ritenour to the Zoning Hearing Board; term to expire the first Monday of 2016."

A vote upon the adoption of the resolution resulted as follows: Affirmative were Karpiak, Geyer, Ritch, Weaver and Mayor Matthews. The majority of the votes being affirmative, the resolution was adopted.

Resolution No. 5-5-2013: "To reappoint Shawn Pilla to the Zoning Hearing Board; term to expire the first Monday of 2018."

A vote upon the adoption of the resolution resulted as follows: Affirmative were Karpiak, Ritch, Geyer, Weaver and Mayor Matthews. The majority of the votes being affirmative, the resolution was adopted.

Matthews noted that the Zoning Board has become a very viable board for the City with the passing of the new Zoning Ordinance. He announced there are three members and the City still needs one more member and asked that anyone interested please let Council know. Matthews added that if you are on the Zoning Board, you cannot be on any other board in the City.

Resolution No. 5-6-2013: "To reappoint Paul Whipkey to the Shade Tree Commission, term to expire the first Monday in January 2018."

A vote upon the adoption of the resolution resulted as follows: Affirmative were Karpiak, Geyer, Ritch, Weaver and Mayor Matthews. The majority of the votes being affirmative, the resolution was adopted.

Resolution No. 5-7-2013: "To direct Connellsville Redevelopment Authority to revise the City's FFY (Federal Fiscal Year) 2010 CDBG program to add replacement of the stage flooring to the existing previously approved Community Center line item activity. Retroactive to May 8, 2013."

Councilman Ritch explained the stage at the Community Center is being replaced. He thanked Paula at the Redevelopment Authority for gathering information so this project could be completed.

A vote upon the adoption of the resolution resulted as follows: Affirmative were Karpiak, Geyer, Ritch, Weaver and Mayor Matthews. The majority of the votes being affirmative, the resolution was adopted.

Resolution No. 5-8-2013: "To advertise to accept bids for the 2003 Ford Taurus used by the Police Department; bids to be Certified or Cashier's Check or Money Order and accompanied by 10% Bid Bond in a sealed envelope returned to the City Clerk's Office, 110 North Arch Street, Connellsville, PA 15425 no later than 4 PM on June 19, 2013; The City of Connellsville reserves the right to reject all bids."

A vote upon the adoption of the resolution resulted as follows: Affirmative were Karpiak, Ritch, Geyer, Weaver and Mayor Matthews. The majority of the votes being affirmative, the resolution was adopted.

Resolution No. 5-9-2013: "TO CONFIRM THE USE OF THE CONNELLSVILLE SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER AND AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE CONNELLSVILLE AREA SENIOR CITIZEN CENTER'S PREPARATION AND FILING OF A REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION PETITION WITH THE FAYETTE COUNTY BOARD OF ASSESSMENT FOR THE SENIOR CITIZEN CENTER PROPERTY OWNED BY THE CITY OF CONNELLSVILLE AND LOCATED AT 100 EAST FAYETTE STREET, CONNELLSVILLE, FAYETTE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AT NO COST TO THE CITY."

A vote upon the adoption of the resolution resulted as follows: Affirmative were Karpiak, Ritch, Geyer, Weaver and Mayor Matthews. The majority of the votes being affirmative, the resolution was adopted.

Resolution No. 5-10-2013: "TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT OF SALE TRANSFERRING THE AARON'S BUILDING PROPERTY LOCATED AT 139 N. PITTSBURGH STREET, CONNELLSVILLE, PENNSYLVANIA, AND ANY ADJACENT PROPERTIES ACQUIRED BY THE CITY, TO TERRANCE C. SHALLENBERGER, JR. ON THE CONDITION THAT HE RENOVATE, RESTORE, OR DEMOLISH THE AARON'S BUILDING WITHIN EIGHTEEN MONTHS OF RECEIVING THE PROPERTY, AND SUBJECT TO SUCH OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS AS MAY BE AGREEABLE TO THE PARTIES; AND TO AUTHORIZE THE CONNELLSVILLE REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO BEGIN THE PROCESS OF REALLOCATING TO OTHER CITY PROJECTS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDS PREVIOUSLY ALLOCATED TO THE DEMOLITION OF THE AARON'S BUILDING."

Matthew noted Council has been working on this a long time and if no further snags appear, the City will be grateful to Mr. Shallenberger.
