

### **MAKING WAVES**

This spring SoMar Dance Works plans to make waves with their upcoming community collaboration *National Water Dance Erie: The Ripple Effect*, a project designed to build community, celebrate one of earth's precious resources, and raise awareness for global to local water concerns. Occurring across the nation at local waterways on April 14<sup>th</sup> at 4pm, the interdisciplinary Erie performance pathway will begin at Dobbins Landing (weather permitting), follow along the waterfront, enter the Erie Maritime Museum (transformed into interdisciplinary exhibits in unexpected spaces), continue past activity tables, research displays, and exhibits, and culminate with a short, but meaningful program in the HIRT Auditorium that interweaves science, dance, poetry, music and more.
