## PPQG Day Meeting Minutes Aug. 13 via Zoom

Meeting was opened at 10:10 a.m. by Rhonda Gianturco, Guild President. She welcomed attendees. September meetings were currently planned for in-person at Hilton Baptist Church as well as on Zoom, but with the COVID situation everyone should watch emails in case the meetings were forced to go to Zoom only. She then confirmed that Mark Fowler is now the Day Coordinator as approved by the Executive Board and thanked him for stepping in. She also put in a plea for volunteers for the Day Secretary and for Day and Night Program people to work with the existing Program Committee. In addition, we need volunteers to wear the UFO crown after the "abdication" of longtime Queens Lois Bates and Nancy Shrout. Please contact Rhonda or any Board member quickly.

Mark Fowler asked for the number of attendees -- 24 members, 2 guests, and 2 presenters. One of the guests, Petrina Greer, introduced herself and said she has been quilting for about five years.

Motion for approval of the July meeting minutes was made by Lori Murdock and seconded by Joan Kelly. Motion carried. Lois Bates moved to accept the July Treasurer's Report for audit, seconded by Rita Crawford. Motion carried.

Mark quickly walked through some tips for choices the user can make while logging into Zoom. He suggested everyone set their device on mute and use the space bar when speaking.

August birthdays were recognized at the July Day Chapter meeting.

Cathy Fowler asked that participants in the 2021 Quilt Challenge include in their artist's statement the names of the four+ types of blocks they use in their quilts. Members can still sign up for the Challenge by email, mail, or phone and pay their \$2 when meeting in person.

Mark announced that Zoomers will be included in the door prize drawings during hybrid meetings in the future. To work, Zoomers need to sign in with their full names.

Debbie Moore, Membership Chair said that new member information is updated as acquired. The membership drive for 2022 will start around October 2021, costing \$30 for renewal.

Joan Kelly reported that there were two hearts and a couple of quilts donated this past month. If there are more, email Joan or Gala Damato for pick up.

Rita Crawford said that she and Ingrid Kross were now doing the Night Chapter Monthly Mini's and asked for contributions. Will pick up if available. She thanked Joy Duke and Nancy Garnett for their 14 years of doing this job.

Debi Cross said the Symposium Committee has met once and will have a second meeting next week.

Barbara Linde outlined upcoming programs using a chart that she will send to Linda Odell for posting to the website and to include in the newsletter. In addition to programs on that chart, they are working on having a program by the Gee's Bend Quilters, hopefully in April or May of 2022. The newsletter will also carry information on a Guild-sponsored workshop by Cheryl Sleboda to be held by Zoom on Nov. 13, "Fast, Fun Fabric Manipulation." Cost will be \$35 for the class and \$30 for the class kit. Check should be made out to PPQG and given to Barbara Linde. Registrations received no later than Oct. 30 will be mailed their kits directly from Cheryl Sleboda.

Barbara then introduced the program speakers, James Hopkins and Ravina Kaur from the Quilts for Kids Nepal charity. Their presentation described the origin and mission of the charitable effort in funding education for children in this extremely poor community. Up to 30 women now participate in making quilts for sale, providing them income options they never had and providing education never before available for these children. The charity markets about 100 quilts a year and relies on these sales and donations to support its work. The website for these sales is www.quiltsforkidsproject.com

Natalie Hutchinson provided a tour of her wonderful sewing room and minimal stash, even though she is currently visiting her mother in California. The wonders of technology!

The meeting concluded following Show and Tell, about 12:15 p.m.
