### \*Orphans

The 35 kinds closed school on 1<sup>st</sup> August 2008 and where allowed to go home for a holiday but to be coming twice a week. The orphans have been coming as they were told on Tuesdays & Saturdays from around 08: 30 am to 13: 30 pm and depart after having their lunch through the holiday.

### \*Structure

With structures at the project no improvement has been made apart from what you left and what I gave you in ZOA Serenje - 1<sup>st</sup> July 2008 Report.

Mr. Mwansa has bought some timber to be used for temporal Dinning structure to be belt at the project. The timber is still in the forest (as told by him) hence, I couldn't have access to pick photos of them. It is waiting for transportation to the site from the forest.

He also brought the Washing machine on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2008 from Lusaka as you wanted to know the progress about it but it has no user manual. It has been kept at his place because power is not yet installed at the project.

### \* Garden

With the garden only beds and nothing else has been done. I was expecting to get some information from Mr. Hara today on his discussion with the Mr Mulenga over the irrigation furrow but he didn't show up or phone me. I tried to phone him but his phone has been off. In few days to come I will update you with development of their discussion. I thought of not delaying the report further.
