Please note: the judges named against all classes are provisional and may be altered once numbers of entries are confirmed. Confirmation of judges will be on the ring plan which will be sent out with running orders.

## ELIGIBILTYFORCLASSES

In the following definitions of classes, First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events exœepted). Only a first plaœ with a clear round completed within the course time setby the judge will count towards grade progression.
Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: 'ARamp', Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso, classes are defined as follows: -

A maximum of fourstandard dasses may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition. Any number of special dasses may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A class may be eitherheld as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consedutive Gradeswith separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in $\mathrm{H}(1)(\mathrm{A}) 11$. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade. To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club Liœensed Agility Shows. Only a first plaœ with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at Small, Medium, Intermediate or Large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.
Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot retum to a previous grade.
Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade once the entries have closed.

## STANDARDCLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club lioensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

## Grade 1

Open to owners, handlers or dogswhich have not gained a minimum of two first plaœs at Grade 1 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.

## Grade 2

Open to dogswhich are not eligible for Grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades $3,4,5,6$, or 7 .

## Grade 3

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club Lieensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7 .

## Grade 4

Open to dogswhich have gained a minimum of three first places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club Liensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, $3,5,6$ or 7

## Grade 5

Open to dogswhich have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7

## Grade 6

Open to dogswhich have gained a minimum of four first plaœes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, wo of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades $2,3,4,5$ or 7 .

## Grade 7

Open to dogswhich have gained a minimum of five first plaœes at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

## SPECIAL CLASSES

## (cannot count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at KC shows)

HELTAR SKELTER:A jumping course based on a decreasing or increasing circle.
STEEPLECHASE: A jumping course consisting of $j \mathrm{mps}$ (not including a spread or long jump) and at least one pipe tunnel. There will be no weaves in the course.

VETERANS: Open to all dogs 9 years or over on the day of the show and not entered in any other classes over the weekend (other Veteran and Any Size classes exœpted). These classes will not include a tyre or weaves. Competitors can choose what height to jump ( $400 \mathrm{~mm}, 300 \mathrm{mmor} 200 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). The length of the long jump will be as per KC standard. The course time will be 60 seconds. All dogs will compete against each other over the same course with one set of awards.

ANY SZZ: Open to all dogs not entered in any other classes over the weekend (Veteran and Any size classes exœepted.). These classes will not include a tyre or weaves. Competitors can choosewhat height to jump ( $400 \mathrm{~mm}, 300 \mathrm{mmor} 200 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). The length of the long jump will be as per KC standard. The course time will be 60 seconds. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course with one set of awards.

JUNIORS: These rules apply to classes 45 and 143. The YKC classes have their own rules.
All juniors must be under 18 on the day of competing. Under 12's is open to handlers under 12 years on show day and Over 12's is 12 years old and over (but under 18) on show day. All equipment heights will be in line with normal KC standard. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's applicable jumpheight with one set of awards for each age group. Each junior can only run a maximum of two dogs and any dog cannot be run by more than one junior.

## HEIGHT UMIT FORDOGS

Large Dogs - For dogs measuring over 430 mm at the withers.
Intermediate Dogs - For dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers.
Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350 mm and measuring 430 mm or under at the withers.
Small dogs - For dogs measuring 350 mm or under at the withers.
Dogs competing in Small, Medium or Intermediate height categories must be measured for competition. Competitors must ensure that their dog is measured prior to their first competition and that the dog's Agility Record Book has been signed and dated by the measuring officials.

Children under the age of 11 are the responsibility of and must be accompanied at all times by a parent or guardian including when competing.

Eligibility
This competition is a special agility competiion open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. In the event of any dispute regarding the parentage of a dog competing in the ABC Agility competition, any concems should be recorded in the IncidentBook and reported to The Kennel Club.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for large dogs are those measuring over 50 cm at the withers. Dogs should be eligible to compete at Grade $1-5$ at the time of qualifying for the semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the semi-final or final.

Competition Rules
The competition will beheld under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these ules and regulations. Standard ules will apply and all equipmentused shall be of a standard size for thatheight category.

The semi-final will consist of one round of agility competition and one round of jumping competition; the top eight dogs qualifying for Cnufts will be those with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the semi-final. If there is equality of faults and time, the agility round will take precedenœ.

The final will consist of one round of agility. The winner of theCrufts Large Novice ABC Agility Stakes will be the dog and handler with the least faults in the fastest time.

## Qualifying

There will be 10 qualifying shows throughout the year. The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded: 1 st place $=10$ points, 2 nd place $=9$ points etc. down to 10 th plaœe $=1$ point. Qualifying points will be awarded down to 10 th even if the sh ow does not award class places down to 10th.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats which have/has not qualified.

The top fifteen dogs, with the most points, will be invited to a semi-final at Disøover Dogs 2021. There will be a charge of $£ 10$ per dog. A maximum of three representatives of any one breed will be invited to the semi-final. This decision will be at the organisers' discretion. Discover Dogs will beheld at Exœel, London. Car parking will not be provided by the Kennel Club. The first eighthighest plaœed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to beheld at Crutts Dog Show, NEC Birmingham in March 2022.

## Eligibility

This competition is a special agility competition open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses. In the event of any dispute regarding the parentage of a dog competing in the ABC Agility competition, any concems should be reoorded in the incidentBook and reported to the Kennel Club.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for intermediate dogs are those measuring over 43 cm and measuring 50 cm orunder at the withers. Dogs should be eligible to compete at Grade 1-5 at the time of qualifying for the semi-final. Any subsequentwins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the semi-final or final.

Competition Rules
The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard ules will apply and all equipmentused shall be of a standard size for thatheight category.

The semi-final will consist of one round of agility competition and one round of jumping competition; the top 8 dogs qualifying for Crufts will be those with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the semi-final. If there is equality of faults and time, the agility round will take precedenœ.

The final will consist of one round of agility. The winner of the Crufts intermediate Novice ABC Agility Stakes will be the dog and handler with the least faults in the fastest time.

Qualifying
There will be 10 qualifying shows throughout the year. The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded: 1 st place = 10 points, 2 nd place $=9$ points etc. down to 10th plaœ $=1$ point. Qualifying points will be awarded down to 10 th even if the show does not award class places down to 10 th.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats which havehas notqualified.

The top 15 dogs, with the most points, will be invited to a semi-final at Discover Dogs 2021. There will be a charge of $£ 10$ per dog. Car parking will not be provided by The Kennel Club.

Eligibility
This competition is a special agility competition open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of theircrosses. In the event of any dispute regarding the parentage of a dog competing in the ABC Agility competition, any concems should be recorded in the hcidentBook and reported to The Kennel Club.

Those dogs eligible to compete in Medium dog competition are those measuring over 35 cm and those measuring 43 cm or under at the withers and eligible to compete in combined Grades 1 to 7 for Medium dogs.

Competition Rules
The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipmentused shall be of a standard size for thatheight category.

The semi-final will consist of one round of agility competition and one round of jumping competition; the top 8 dogs qualifying forCrufts will be those with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the semi-final. If there is equality of faults and time, the agility round will take preœdence.

The final will consist of one round of agility. The winner of the Crufts Medium ABC Agility Stakes will be the dog and handler with the least faults in the fastest time.

Qualifying
There will be 10 qualifying shows throughout the year. The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded: 1 st place $=10$ points, Znd place $=9$ points etc. down to 10 th plaœe $=1$ point. Qualifying points will be awarded down to 10 th even if the show does not award class places down to 10th.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats which havehas notqualified.

The top 15 dogs, with the most points, will be invited to a semi-final at Discover Dogs 2021. There will be a charge of $£ 10$ per dog. A maximum of three representatives of any one breed will be invited to the semi-final. This decision will be at the organisers' discretion. Disoover Dogs will beheld at Excel, London. Car parking will not be provided by The Kennel Club.

The first eighthighest placed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Crufts Dog Show, NEC Birmingham in March 2022.

## Cruft's Kennel Club Medium \& Small Novice Cup Agility Stakes 2021-2023

## Eligibility

All events must be judgedunder the appropriate Kennel Club regulations H \& $\mathrm{H}(1)$ in force at the time of the event. Competitors entering any competion will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these regulations.

Dogs should be eligible to enter a Grade 3, 4 or 5 class at the time of qualifying for the semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the Semi-Final or Final.

## Competition Rules

There will be up to 14 separate heats for large, intemediate, medium and small height dogs at Kennel Club licensed shows throughout the country, plus an additional heat on Thursday 12th August at the Intemational Agility Festival.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Semi-Final at the intemational Agility Festival, however only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Semi-Final will qualify for the Crufts Grand Final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Semi-Final, furtherheats may be entered for competition although any placings in these heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for theSemi-Final.

Qualifying
The first two previously unqualified dogs from each heat will go forward to the Semi-Final at the Kennel Club Intemational Agility Festival 2022. There will also be a Novice Cup heat at the Kennel Club Intemational Agility Festival, where the first five previously unqualified placed dogs will also go forward to the Semi-Final. If the heat is split then two dogs will be taken from each part.

If a competitor does not take up the invitation to compete in the semi-final, the invitation will be rolled down to the next applicable dog from the relevant heat.

The top six large dogs, six intermediate, six medium dogs and six small dogs from the Semi-Final round of the Kennel ClubNoviœe Cup will be invited to compete in the Final at Crufts 2023.

Please note that due to Covid-19 cancelled heats, there will be no semi-final in 2021. Dogs and handlers who qualify for the 2021 semi-final will have their qualification carried forward to the semi-final at the International Agility Festival in 2022.

HE KENNEL CLL

## Discover Dogs Small / Mixi Pairs Challenge (Special) 2021

This is a competition consisting of eightheats of jumping. The competition is open to small dogs, partinering a medium dog, intemediate dog or a large dog, and heats will be scheduled as a Special combined class for grades 1 to 7 .

## Eligibility

The competition is open to two dogs with separatehandlers. One dog must be a small dog, 35 cm or under at the withers, the partner can be a medium dog, over 35 cm but 43 cm or under at the withers, or an intermediate dog over 43 cm and measuring 50 cm or under at the withers, or a large dog over 50 cm .

Handlers with more than one dog may enter in more than one pair. However, they may only qualify a maximumof two dogs for the final. No substiute handlers will be allowed in the final.

Should a qualified dog or handler within a pair be unable/unfit to enter the final that pair will not be able to compete. Their place in the final will be offered to the next available pair with the highest points who have not qualified.

Competition Rules
The competition will beheld under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipmentused shall be of a standard size for thatheight category.

This is nomally a relay competition involving a baton change between each dog's run. However due to Covid-19 there will beno baton changeover and the event will be run as 2 individual scored runs following each other. The times and faults of each dog's un will be added together to produce a pairs score.

An elimination will incur a penalty of 100 faults. Once a dog has been eliminated it cannot incur further faults. However, if either member of the pair fail to complete the course or either of the dogs foul the ring the pair will be disqualified.

The competition will involve changes of height of the obstacles being jumped by the medium mintermediate/large dogs at two stages during the class. The judge will decide which height of dog to start with and will announœe the changes of heightwhen relevant. It is the competi tors' responsibility to be available accordingly. The course will be walked by everyone before the beginning of the class.

The final will consist of two rounds of jumping competition. The winners of the Discover Dogs Small / Mixi Pairs will be the pair with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final. DiscoverDogs will beheld at Excel, London in 2021 . Car parking will not be provided by the Kennel Club.

Qualifying
Points will be awarded to the specific pair (consisting of two handlers with their dogs) which competes at the heat. Points are not transferable between different pair combinations. Pairs will score 15 points for 1 st place down to 1 point for 15 th place. Points will be accumulated over all eightheats and the 15 pairs with the most points will go through to the final at DiscoverDogs 2021.

This competion will be classified as combined Grades 5-7 and judged under the Kennel Club Regulations for standard classes.
Dogs should be eligible to enter a Grade 5-7 class at the time of qualifying for the Quarter-Final.
Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Quarter-Finals. However, only the competitor's highest placed dog at the Quarter-Finals will qualify for theSemi-Final.

Once a dog has qualified for the Quarter-Final, furtherheats may be entered for competition although any placings in these furtherheats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Quarter-Final/Semi-Final.

The first 5 previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Quarter-Finals at Vale View Equestrian, if the heat is split then three dogs will be taken from each part. The first 20 dogs from this Quarter-Final will qualify for the Semi-Final held at The London Intemational Horse Show.

The 20 dogswho qualify for The Kennel Club Intermediate Dog Agility Stakes will compete in a Semi-Final held at The London intemational Horse Show. The top 10 highest placed dogs in the Semi-Final will qualify for the evening Grand Final held at The London Intemational Horse Show (subject to the above).

Those dogs eligible to compete in intermediate Dog Agility competitions are those measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers.

The competition is open to all YKC members only, aged 6 years and up to, but not induding $18^{\text {th }}$ birthday handling any Kennel Club registered dog. There are eight classes divided by age of member and size of dog as listed below:

- 6-11 Years with Large/ntermediate/MediumSmall dogs
- 12-17 Years with Large/Intermediate/MediumSmall dogs

Please enter the class age category you will be on the day of the qualifier.
The YKC method for Crufts qualification is a points based system as follows:

- $1^{\text {st }}$ Plac $=30$ points $/ 2^{\text {nd }}$ Place $=15$ points $/ 3^{\text {rd }}$ Place $=10$ points

Points are gained per handler/dog combination. If the same handler gains points with another dog in U 18 J - these points will be separate.
30 or more combined points during the year in U18J competitions should guarantee qualification to the U18J final at next year's Crufts, however, the YKC may have to drastically alterhow members qualify forCnufts 2022. This may be because fewer shows were able to hold YKC qualifiers this year, or possibly that we are required to restrict entry numbers to Crufts 2022 on govemment advice. More up to date qualification information will be released on the YKC website closer to the time. The YKC will endeavour to keep the qualification process as close to the above as possible.
Members must ensure that theirfees to the Young Kennel Club (YKC) are up to date and fully paid in order to enter any Young Kennel Club class. These schedule rules mustbe read in conjunction with the most up to date YKC Agility Rules found on the YKC website.

## Young Kennel Club

The competition is open to YKC members only, aged between 6 and 24 years.
There are 12 classes divided by age of member and size of dog as listed below:

- 6-11 years with large/intermediate/medium/small dogs
- 12-17 years with large/intermediate/medium/small dogs
- 18-24 years with large/intermediate/medium/small dogs

When entering a pair, you should use the age of the oldest member to determine which category to use. At each qualifier, ahandler may only enter 1 age category per dog height, if the handler wishes to enter the same height pairs competition with multiple pairs, all subsequent entries must be for the same age range
e.g. Jim is 9 and has a large dog, he partners with Bob who is 12 also with a large dog. They will enter the "Large 12-17 YKC Pairs" competition. If Jim wants to enter another dog into the "YKC large dog pairs" at this qualifier, he must do so with someone who is in the 12-17 age range (which canbe Bob again providing they are both using differentlarge dogs).
To comply with potential social distancing measures, the baton change has been removed from qualifiers in 2021 and Crufts 2022.
Pairs mustuse the same size dog for both members. Onœ a qualifier has been entered, members may not switch dogs orhandlers.
The pair who are placed first in each category will qualify for Cufts 2022. (12 qualification spots per qualifier.)
The YKC may have to drastically alter how members qualify for Crufts 2022. This may be because fewer shows were able to hold YKC qualifiers this year, or possibly that we are required to restrict entry numbers to Crufts 2022 on govemment advice. More up to date qualification information will be released on the YKC website closer to the time. The YKC will endeavour to keep the qualification process as close to the above as possible.
Both members must ensure that their fees to the Young Kennel Club (YKC) are up to date and fully paid in order to enter any Young Kennel Club class. These schedule rules mustbe read in conjunction with the most up to date YKC Agility Rules found on the YKC website.

## Jean Shaw Trophy

The Jean Shaw Trophy will be awarded to the overall winner of Small Agility G6-7 on Saturday (Class 36). The dog with the leastfaults in the fastest time.
Jean was a long standing club member whom we sadly lost in June 2020. She was a much loved club member who was dedicated to her CKCS dogs. We miss herhugely and we know her many friends on the Agility circuit do too. This trophy is dedicated toher.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel ClubRegulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be retumed to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry fees are $£ 4.50$ per dog per class and $£ 9.00$ per pair.
4. No Prize Money is on offer.
5. Entries will only be acoepted on the official form or photocopy thereof. Entries may also be made via the intemet at www.firstplaceprocessing.co.uk
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendarmonths of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
8. A dog mustnot compete more than onœe in a class, including special classes.
9. NotFor Competition entries will be accepted fordogs aged four calendar months andover. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
10. Nobitch in season is allowed to compete.
11. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
12. No person shall carry out punitive correction orharsh handling of adog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
13. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is pemitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collari.e. not attached by a ring.
14. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Com mittee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
15. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
16. Thank you to our sponsors, The Kennel Club, YKC, Skinners PetFoods, Good Boy, Pawstrading, TuffStuff Ltd, Mini Pinkys, First Plaœe Processing, Voodoo Rosettes, Photizo.
17. The KC qualifiers held at this show are: - Intermediate KC Olympia Agility Stakes, Crufts Large Noviœ ABC Agility Stakes, Crufts Intermediate Novice ABC Agility Stakes, Crufts MediumABCAgility Stakes, Crufts YKC Jumping, Crufts YKC Pairs, Discover Dogs SmallMixi Pairs Challenge, Kennel ClubMedium Noviœe Cup, Kennel Club Small NovioeCup. Detailed rules can be found on the previous pages.
18. Kennel ClubStandard marking Regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. Competitors can choose what height to jump ( $450 \mathrm{~mm}, 350 \mathrm{mmor}$ そ28mm) for Veterans classes. For the Anysize dass the hurdes will be the same asfor Veterans. All other equipment in all other special classes will be as perKC standard.
20. The Heightlimitfor dogs:
a. Large Dogs - For dogs measuring over 500 mm at the withers
b. Intemediate Dogs -For dogs measuring over 430 m m and measuring 500 mm or under at the withers.
c. MediumDogs - Fordogs measuning over 350mmand measuring 430mmorunder at the withers.
d. Small Dogs-For dogs measuring 350 mm or under at the withers.
21. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition adog, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; orhandle a dog at the Showat which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or residentat the same address as the scheduled judge.
२2. Removal of dogs fromCompetition - Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing andor removed from the Show if it is:-
a. Abitch, which is in season.
b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
c. Interfering with the safety or chanœ of winningof an opponent.
d. Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it ©ontinues competing.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be reoorded in the competition/show incidentBook and submitted to the Kennel Club.
23. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
24. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (06/07/2021) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a partioular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitors' responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class (es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
25. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as neœessary. Such changes and the ciroumstances sumounding themmustbe reported to the Kennel Club.
26. In the event that the show is canœelled due to unforeseen circumstanœes, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show procssor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
27. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competibrs are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilstunder test.
28. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
29. Separate entry foms mustbe completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be acoompanied with the appropriate fees.
30. Passes are not required to gain entry to the show/showground.
31. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or infectious Disease - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease orhaving been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined andlor dealt with underKennel Club Rule A11.
32. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
33. Animals in Event - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board.
However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
34. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits
35. A practiœe ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
36. Welfare of Dogs An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch oollars, electronic shock oollars, or prong collars, is not pemitted at any Agility show liœensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
37. All dogs entered at this show are at the owner's risk. Whilstevery care will be taken, the Committee and Organisers will not acoept responsibility for loss, damage or injury, however caused to persons, dogs or property at the show.
38. Overpaid entries will NOTbe refunded.
39. Competitors must follow the instuctions of the Stewardswith respect to parking, camping and conductwithin the showboundaries and any person directing abuse will be removed from the showground.
40. Goods may NOTbe sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of the committee.
41. Campers must remain within their allocated space and MUSTNOT obstruct the roadways. All units must be equipped with own fire extinguishers and/or bucket of water at the tow bar.
42. Training equipment is not allowed.
43. DOGS ARE NOT TOBE LEFTLOOSE IN 'GARDEN' AREASOR TEIHERED TOVEHICLESWITHOUTBEINGATTENDED.
44. No ovemightparking permitted unless a camping space has been booked and paid for and you are within your allocated space. Any persons with vehicles parked ovemight, not in accordanœ with this nule, will be asked to leave the showground.
45. Please pick up after your dog and deposit the waste in the bags provided. If you fail to clean up after your dog, you will be asked to leave the venue.
46. No refunds after closing date other than in exœeptional circumstances and at the organising club's discretion.
47. Rosettes and Trophies will NOT be forwarded.
48. If choosing to download your ring cards you are agreeing to your running orders for this show being available to the public on the web site.

## DIRECTIONS TO

## Locko Park

FROM DERBY
If you are approaching from Derby on the A52 (Brian Clough Way), we recommend leaving the A52 at the A6005 exit towards Borrowash. Then at the roundabout, take the $3^{\text {rd }}$ exit back on to the A52 towards Nottingham but stay on the slip road exiting the A52 again at the Spondon\llkeston A6096 exit immediately before Spondon Methodist Church. This is easier, if you are towing, than taking the exit directly off the A52.

As the road bears to the right tum left onto Church Street, sign posted HeanorlMorley and also marked by a brown road sign for Bluebells Ice Cream Farm.

Continue up Church Street, past St Werburghs School on the right-hand side and the road changes to be Locko Road. Continue up Locko Road until you go past the Cricket club on right-hand side and out on to a country lane.

Go past 'Bluebells loe Cream Farm' and then the entrance to Locko Park is situated to the right as the road bends round to the left. Look out for Agility signs at the roadside.

## FROM NOTTINGHAM $\backslash$ M1 SOUTHBOUND

If you are approaching from NottinghamMM1 J25 leave the A52 at Spondon exit (signposted SpondonlChaddesden) by Asda, go around the roundabout and head back towards Nottingham (A52) but stay on the slip road and follow the directions as above.

## FROM M1 NORTHBOUND

If you are approaching from M1 J24 then take the A50 towards Derby/UttoxeterlStoke. Leave the A50 at Junction 2 and take the A6 towards Derby up Raynesway (50mph speed limit), which is the second exit off the roundabout. At the end of Raynesway get into the outside lane and at the roundabout take the 3rd exit, past Asda on your right. At the next roundabout take the exit for Nottingham (A52) but stay on the slip road and follow the directions as above.

## SAT NAV

Do not use the postcode DE21 7BW for Sat Navs. Use 'Locko Road, Spondon' or DE21 7AR (for Bluebells Ice Cream Farm) instead.
